<p>Math facts about YOU: Write equations where the answer is the number about you. Example: Age: Your teacher is 35. $5 \times 7 = 35$. Choose 4 different topics and write an equation for each: age, weight, height, number of family members, house number, number of pets, favorite number, phone number, shoe size, etc.</p>	<p>Create 3 character trading cards (like Pokemon) from your favorite book. Remember to include the character's name, a picture, and at least 3 characteristics (traits) for each character.</p>	<p>Write a letter to someone and send it in the mail or deliver it if they live in your home. <p>Show at least 5 different ways to make \$2.67. Draw pictures of each coin/bill combination.</p>	<p>Talk to someone at home. Ask them what their favorite book is. What was it about? Why did they like it? What was their favorite part?</p>	<p>Write a letter to your future self. Tell yourself what is going on in the world right now. Share how you are feeling. Describe how unique your experience is.</p>	<p>Find materials in nature and create something using those materials. Example: Find sticks, rocks, and leaves, and make an animal such as a butterfly.</p>	<p>If you have gloves and/or protective gear, clean up your neighborhood. Try to separate the recyclables from the trash. Be sure to wash your hands thoroughly when you are finished.</p>
<p>Draw an imaginary garden by making an array. Then find the area and perimeter of the garden. Include specific information. Ex: I need one row of 6 tomato plants, etc.</p>	<p>Take a blanket/towel outside and read your book under a tree.</p>	<p>Call an adult (grandma, grandpa, aunt, uncle) who does not live with you. Ask them about a historical event. Write down their answers. Ask them what they remember, how they felt, and where they were when it happened.</p>	<p>Trace everyone's hand in your family. Put each tracing either on a different colored paper, or all on white and then color them all a different color. Layer them from largest to smallest as a keepsake of who has been staying at home with you.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Trace shadows of toys, people, shoes, etc. Decorate and color those shadows.</p>	<p>Help your family prepare and make a meal. You can be the one to set the table. Eat the meal at the table. Turn off all electronics during the meal. Ask your family questions. Enjoy family time!</p>
