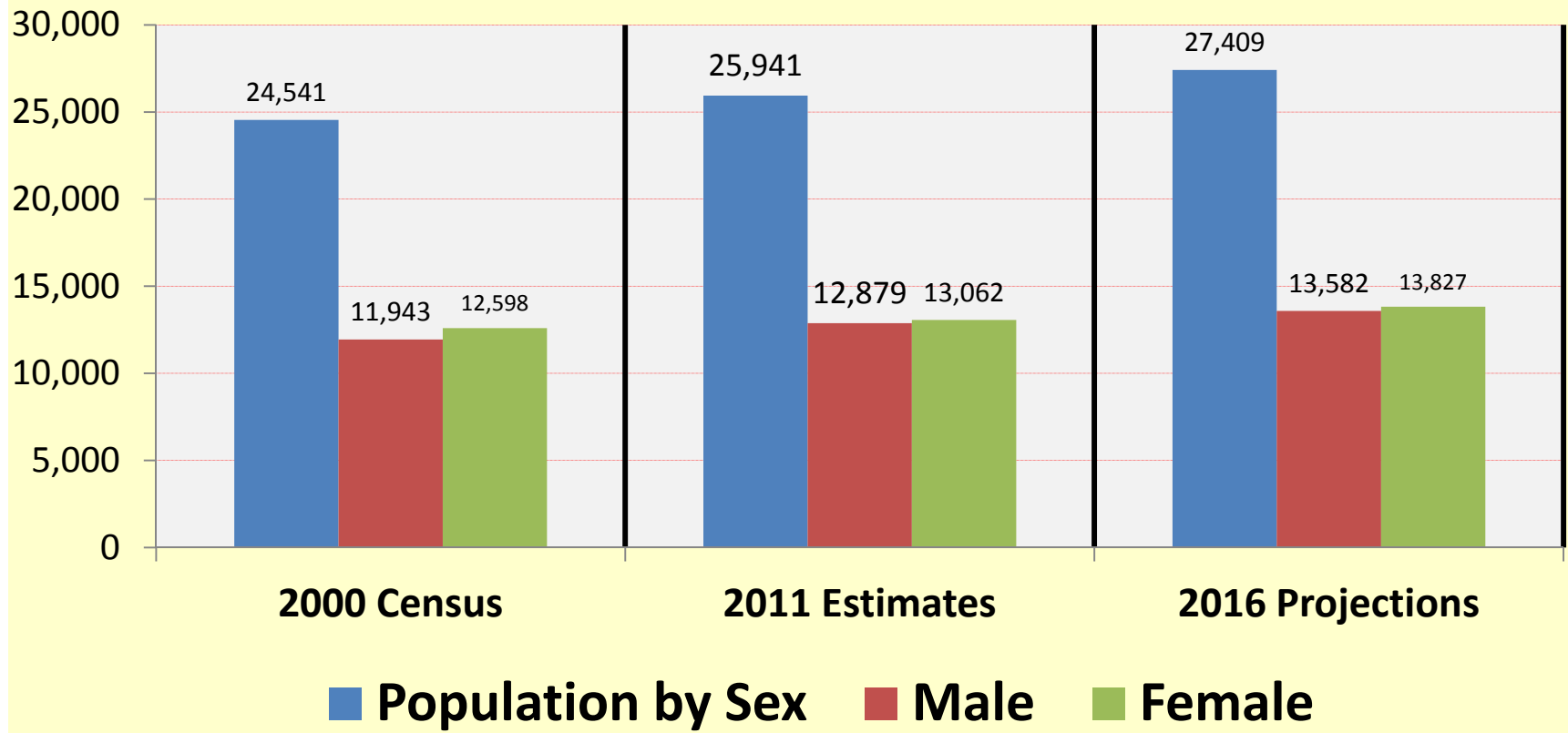

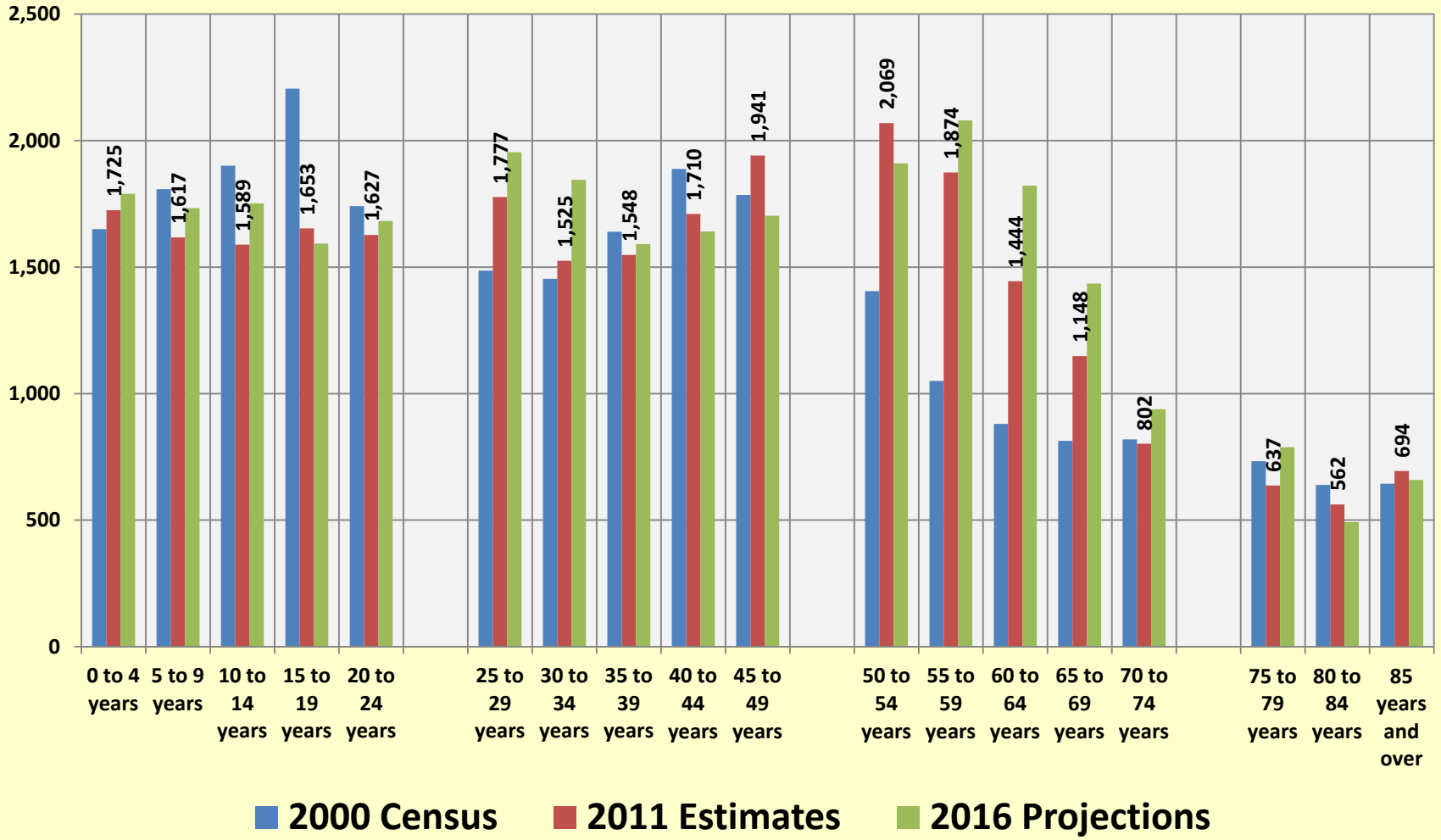

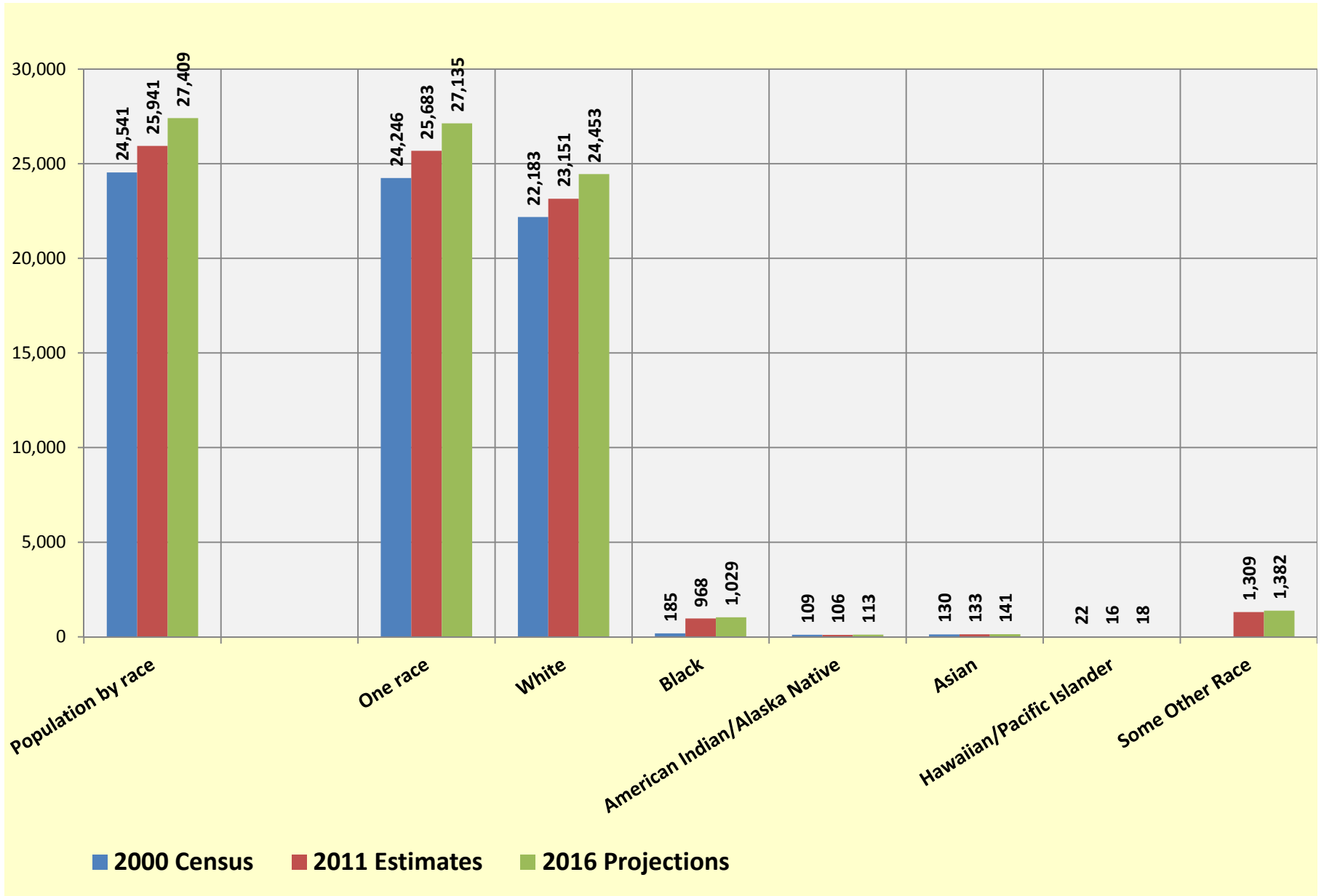
Population by Gender Willmar Public Schools



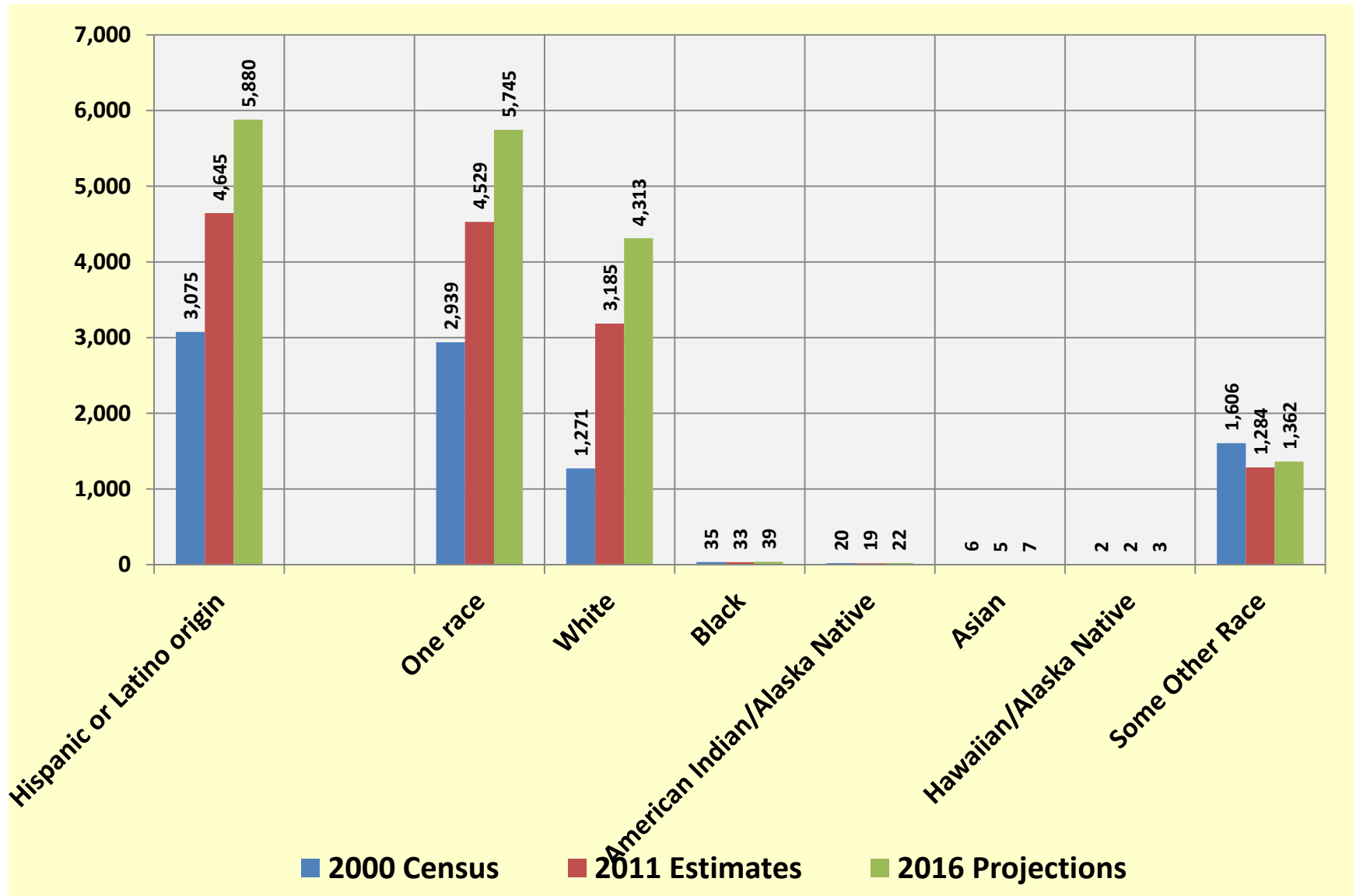
Population by Age Grouping



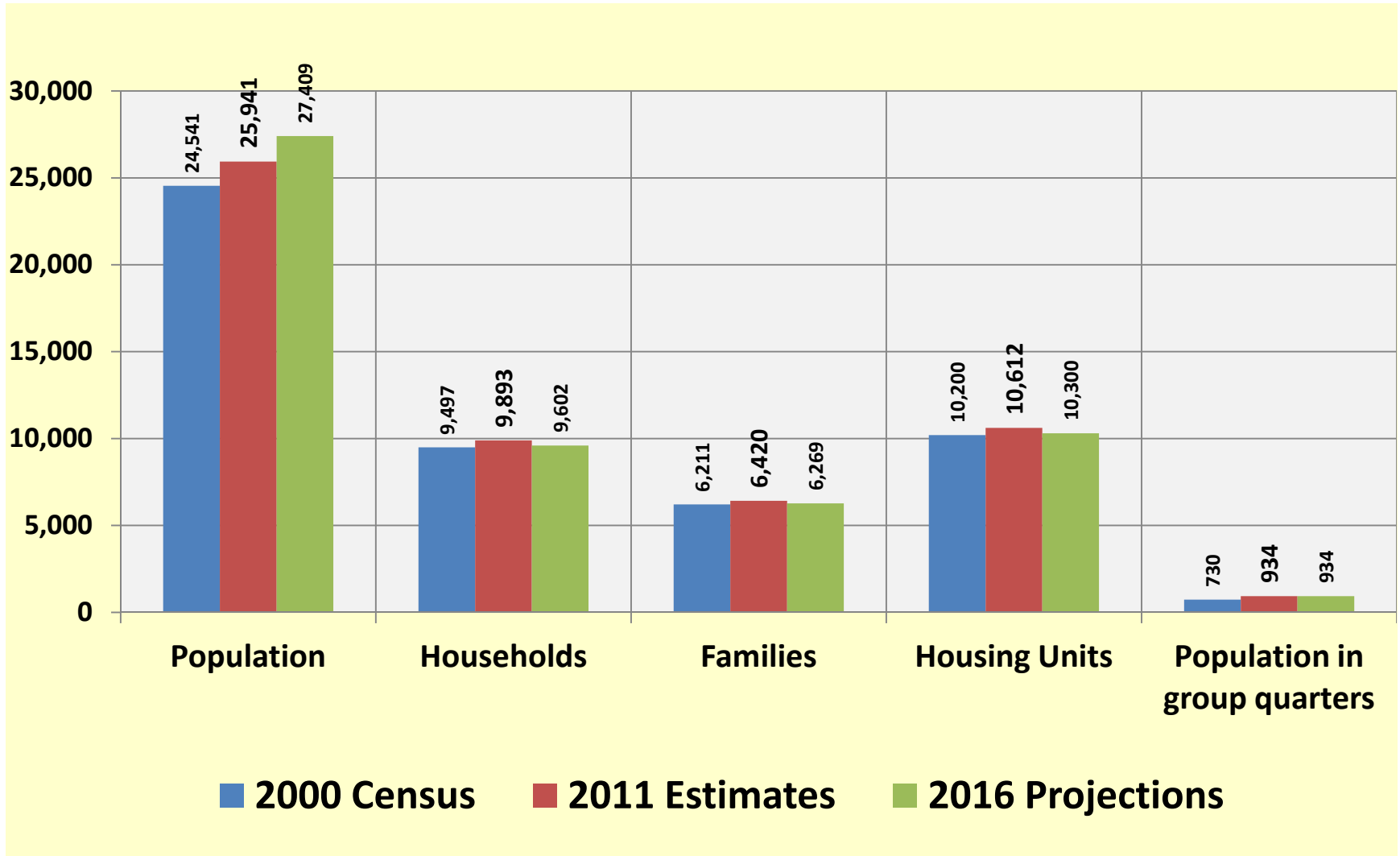
Population by Race



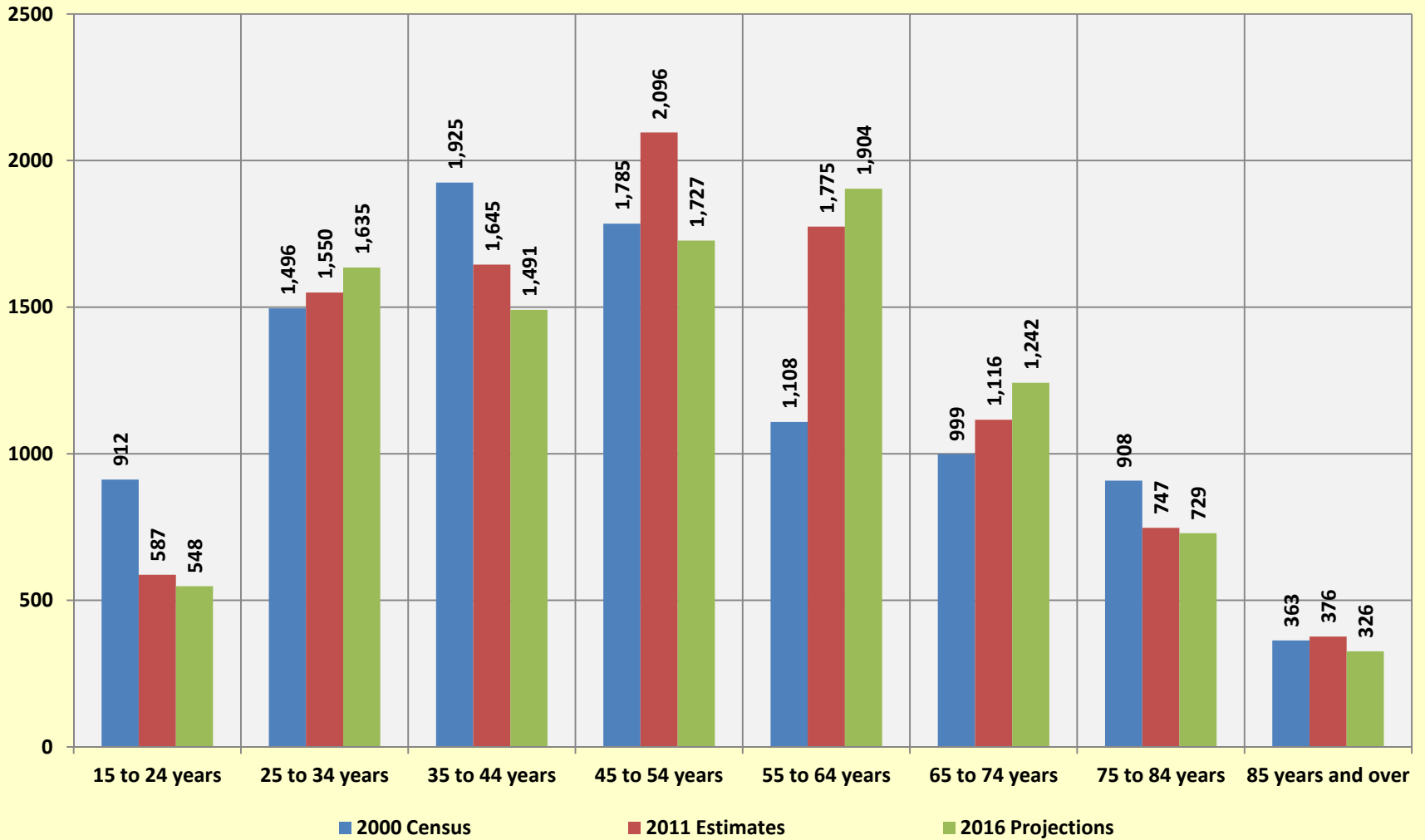
Population by Latino Origin



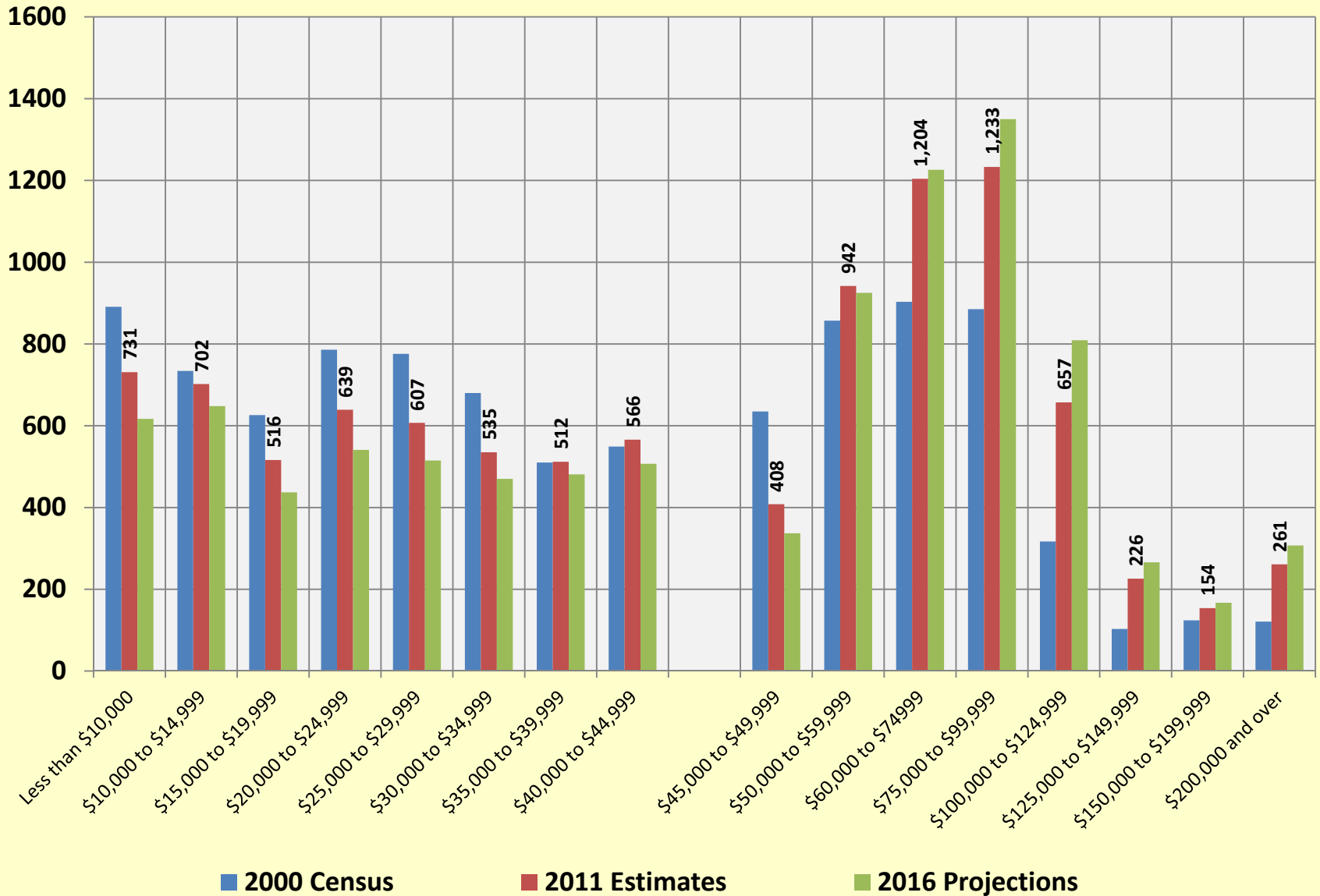

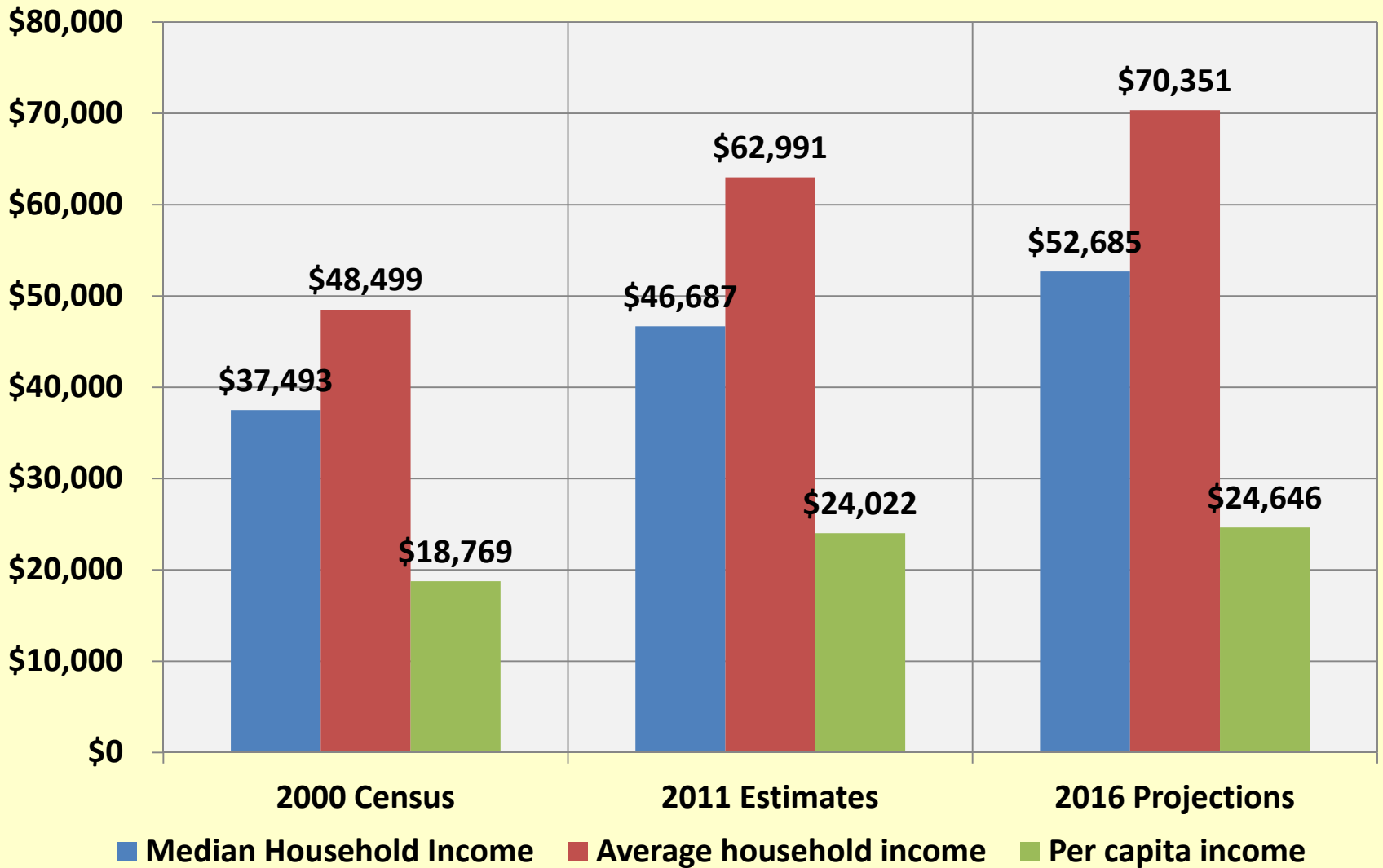

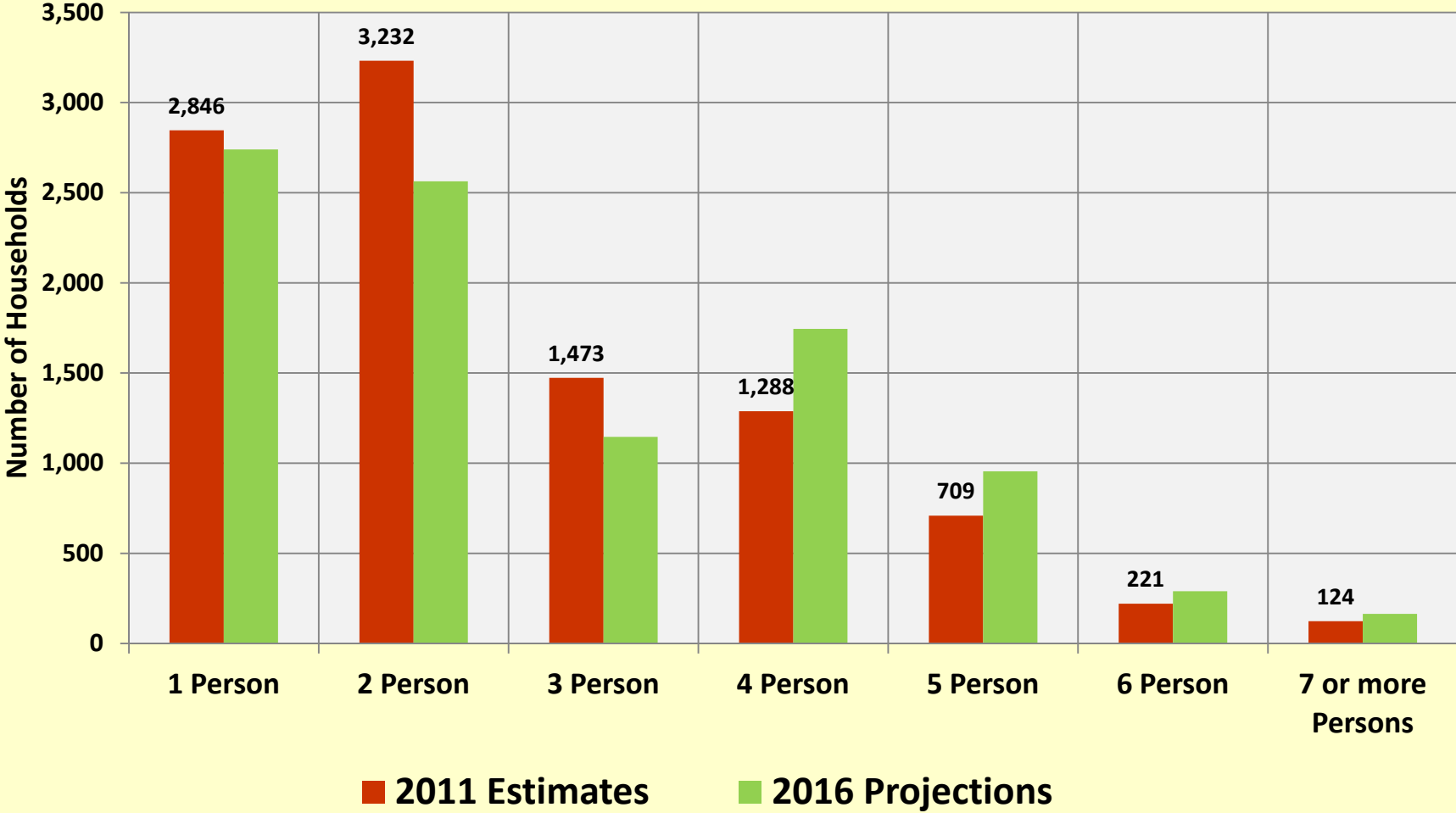

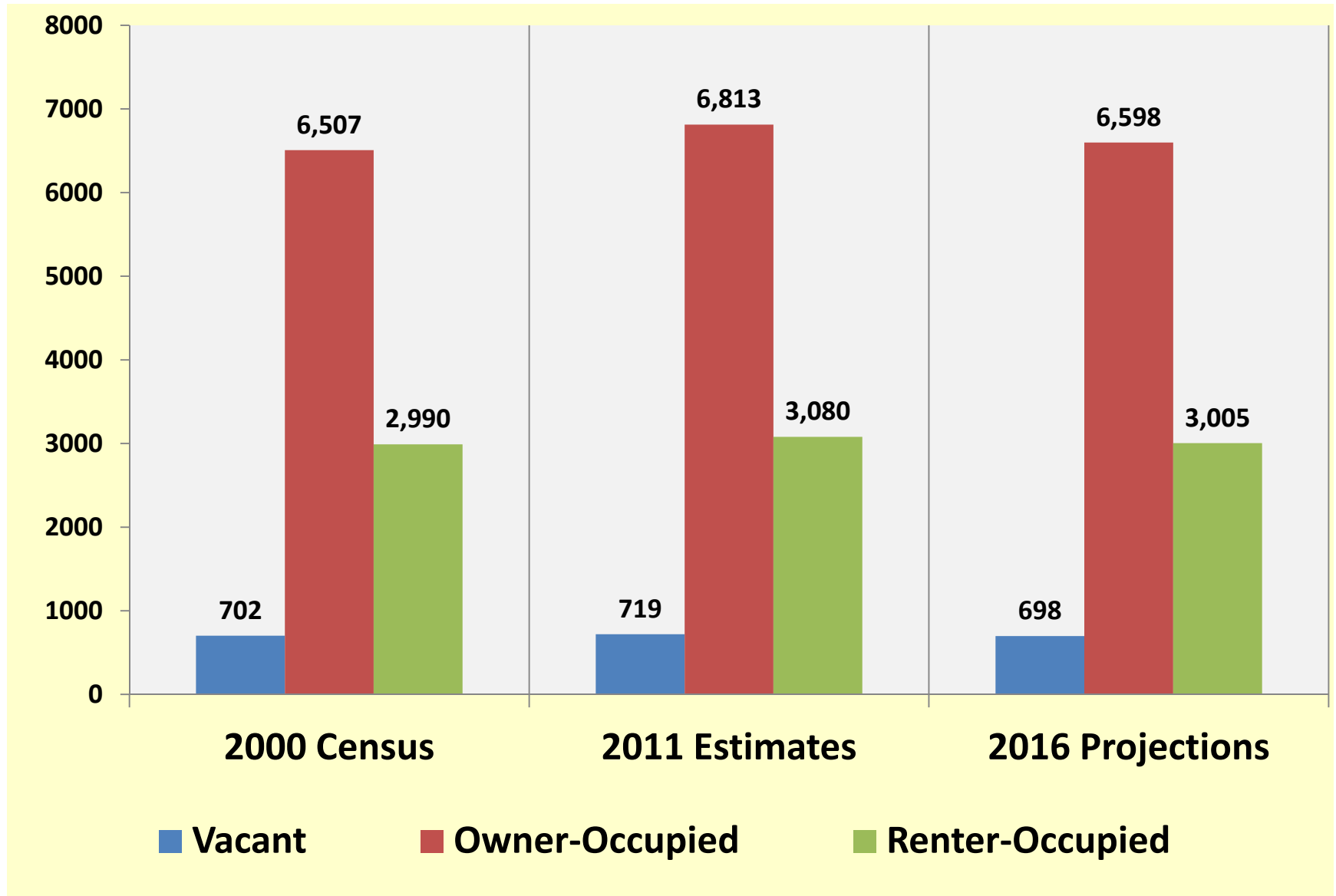
Median, Average, and Per capita Income by Household



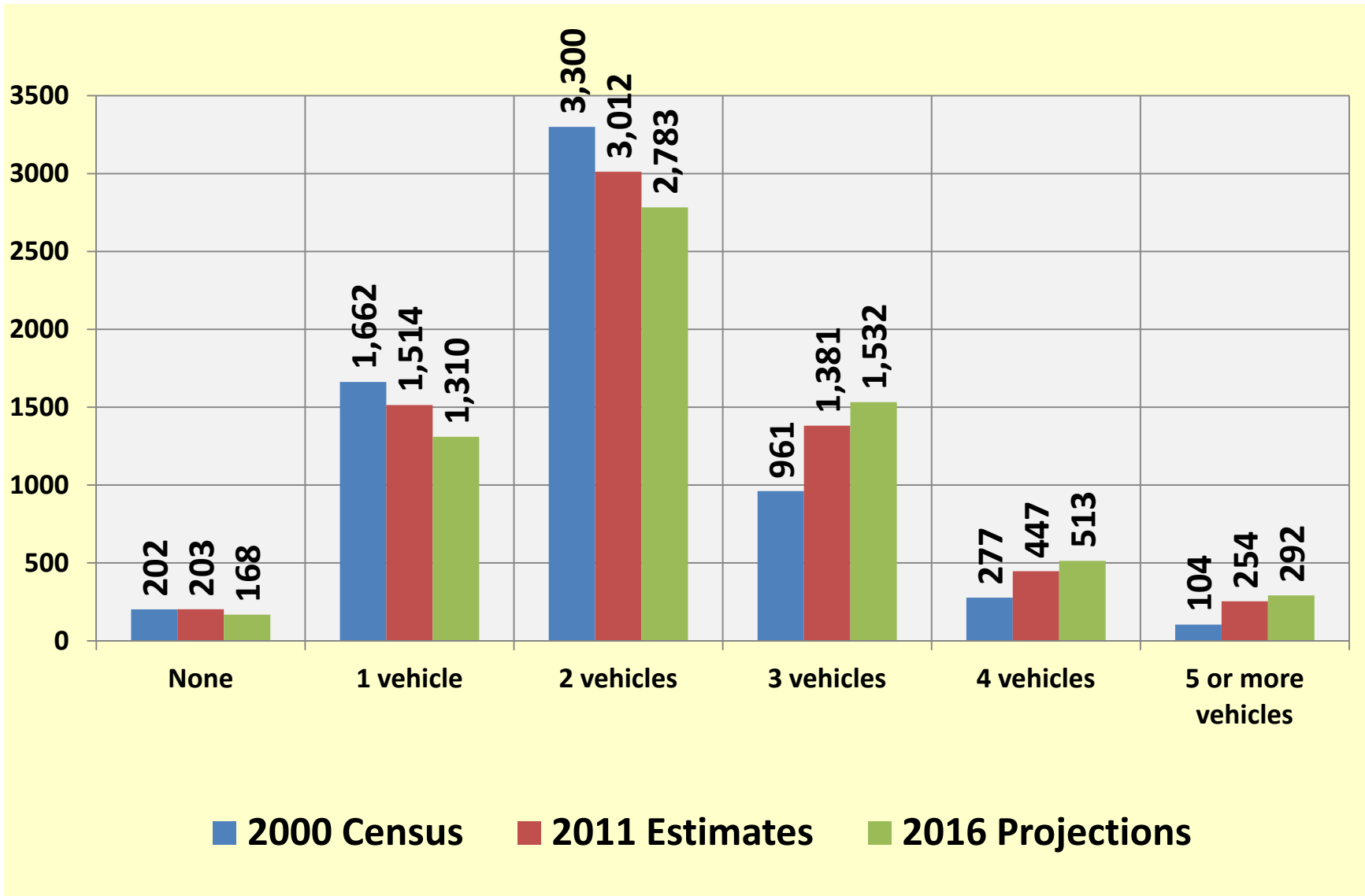
Households by Size



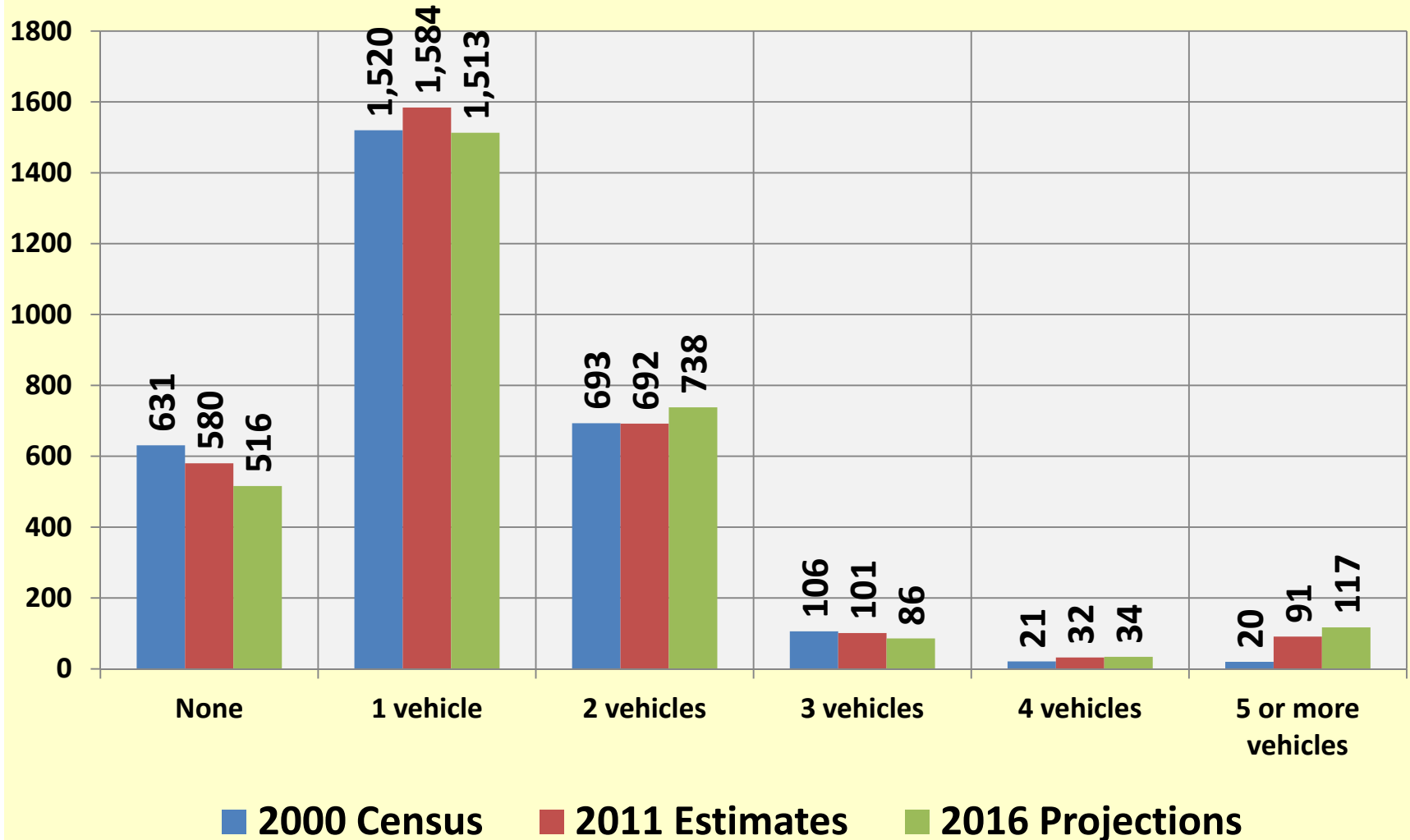
Number of Households by Occupancy Status



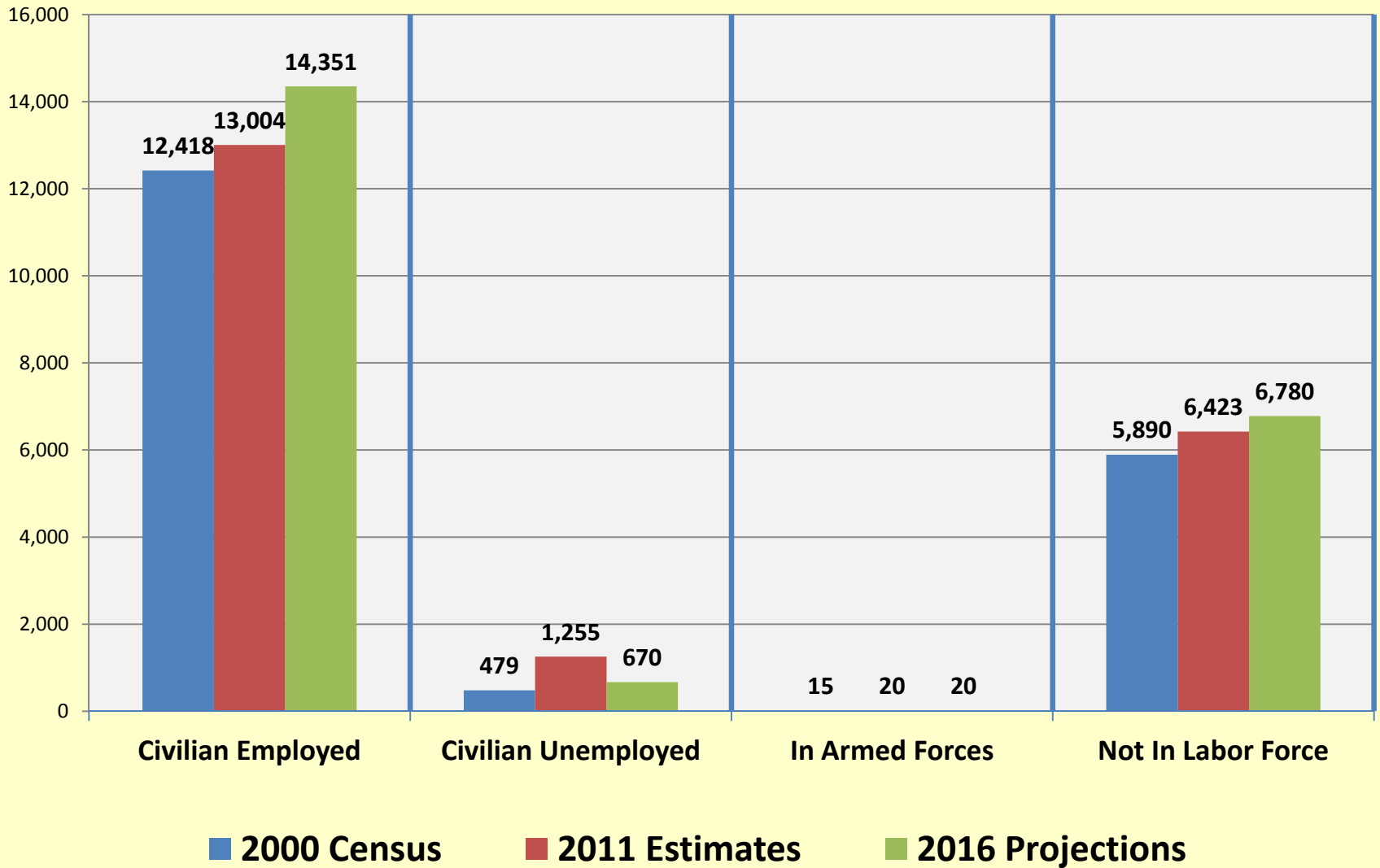
Owner Households by Vehicles Available



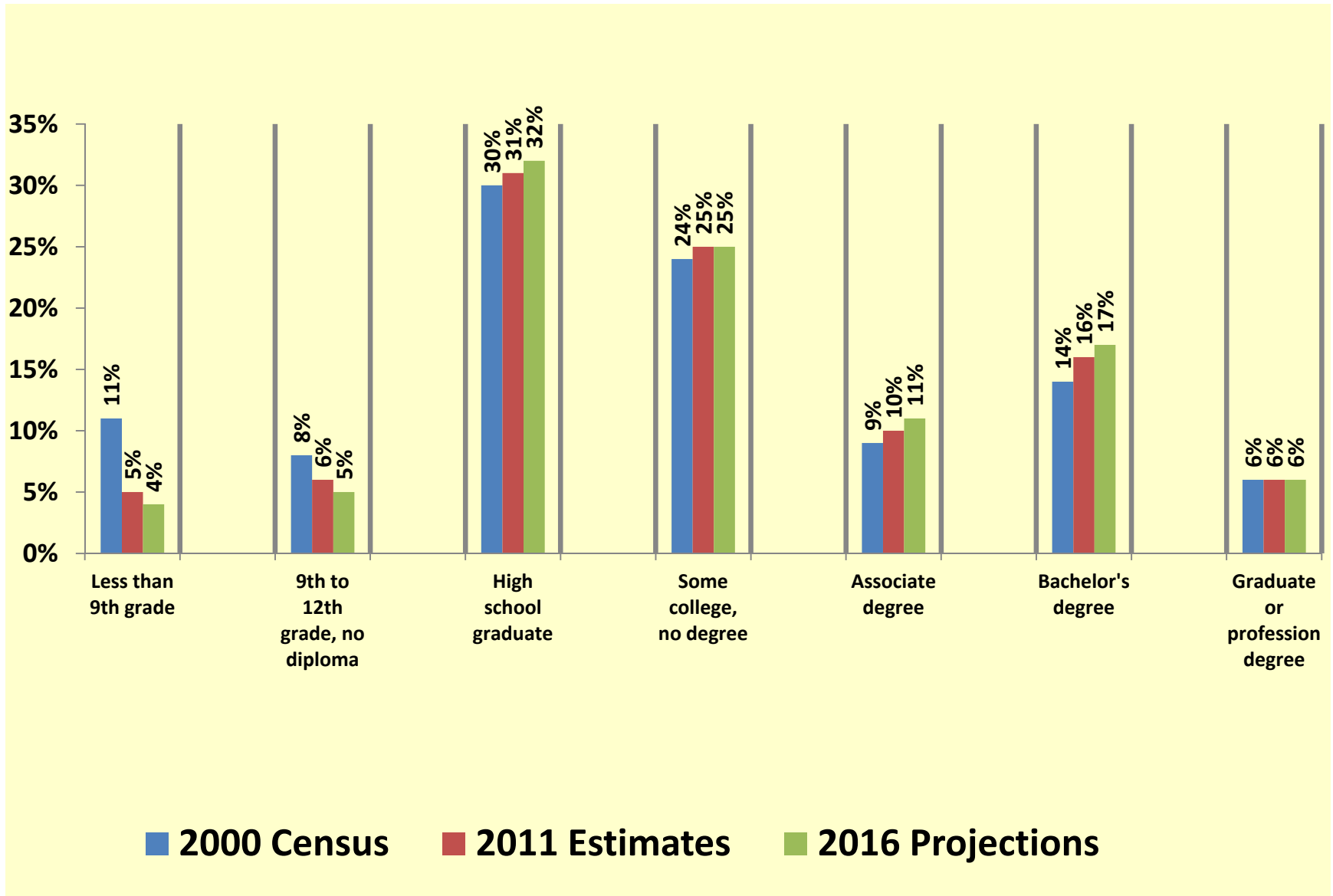
Renter Households by Vehicles Available
