One thing you have heard about recently in the news is the amount and purpose behind testing that occurs with the students. We do two types of testing or assessments. One is a standardized assessment that happens in the spring and they are called our Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments. The main purpose of that test is to compare ourselves to other schools in the state in regard to how we are performing on the state standards in reading, math, and science. The other types of assessments that happen frequently are called formative assessments or progress monitoring. These assessments are typically done in both math and reading, guiding us as teachers to be more responsive to the learning needs of our students. They are small snapshots that we use weekly, monthly, or quarterly to gauge our student's performance on any particular concept or task.

Teaching has become very student responsive. We alter our instructions and our materials frequently to better meet the needs of the student's readiness levels that we can see because we do administer these assessments. If you ever have any questions, I'd be happy to help explain, so please do not hesitate to call me.
