Wear your suit, and bring a towel and goggles. An informational parent meeting will be held in the Choir Room at 6:15 p.m. This is for new Stingrays swimmers only. Fall Session for all returning swimmers begins Tuesday, September 13th. All ages welcome! We ask that the swimmer has completed Level 4 in swimming lessons, or can swim the length of the pool and back. Swimmers can even try Stingrays for two weeks before committing. (A membership fee is needed to start swimming. This fee includes registration, annual MN Swimming Insurance, building fee, and snorkel. If you choose not to continue with Stingrays, this will be refunded.) Practices are Mondays-Thursdays from 5:30-6:30 pm at the Willmar High School Pool. You choose how often you want to come, but we encourage swimmers to attend at least two nights a week. There are also swim meets throughout the year for those interested in competitive swimming.
