



#### **Kindergarten:**

In reading, we will be focusing on asking questions before, during, and after a story. We will also be retelling familiar stories. We have now added two new high frequency words each week as well. In math, we will compare numbers and will also review skills that include patterning, sorting, and shape recognition. Thank you for continuing to support your child at home!

#### 1st Grade:

This month in reading we will be working on retelling stories with key details, understanding the central message or theme of a story, and reading with more fluency. Make sure your child is reading their book at home and encourage them to read smoothly and with expression. In math we will be describing numbers using place value, composing and decomposing numbers, finding 10 more and 10 less than a number, solving story problems, and counting money. You can practice counting money, telling time, and solving basic addition and subtraction facts at home.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade:

Second graders have been very busy working on algebra in Math. We solved for variables in equations, wrote stories that included a variable, and wrote stories that matched a given equation. Our next unit is a study of both two and three dimensional shapes in geometry. In literature, we're honing our skills as "good-fit readers" during our independent reading time. In large group, we are using clues to determine the central message an author is trying to teach us. Soon, we will return to summarizing fiction stories involving a problem. Thank you for emphasizing reading independently at home!







#### 3rd Grade:

Third grade will be working hard on measurement of time, temperature, and money in math. They will also be building up their stamina during Independent Reading. We also will be preparing for out MCA testing!

#### 4th Grade:

The 4th grade is working hard on preparing themselves for the Reading and Math MCA's that will be taken in April. We will be learning more about Area and Perimeter in regular and irregular shapes, and then we will move into our Algebra Unit. In Reading we will be starting our space unit where we will be writing a research paper, and we will be comparing and contrasting point of view from different narrated stories. We are excited about an author that will be visiting our school in April, and we are reading the story "Poppy" together in class. That is what we are doing in 4th grade!

#### 5th Grade:

- \*For reading we will be on Unit 7. This area will be called "Talking About Trash".
- \*Our math area of study will be Algebra Part 2.
- \*In health our focus on Body Systems
- \*We also will be focusing on Author Study- AVI

#### **P.E.**:

We will be playing games in the gym. We will also be practicing our throwing and catching in April.









#### <u>S.T.E.M.:</u>

3rd: We will be wrapping up the Sound and Light Unit and studying the Animals and Plants-Habitats and Adaptations Unit for 3rd Grade

4th: We will be finishing up the Electricity Unit and we will be starting my Favorite Unit on Engineering...It's SMORE MUCH FUN as we do a project with S'mores.

5th: Will be finishing Animal Adaptations and starting our Earth Changing Events Unit

#### EL:

Here are ways to work on language by talking with your child:

As you walk with your child or ride with her in a car or on a bus, talk with them about what their doing at school. As you shop in a store, talk with your child about what you are doing as you go through the store. As you fix dinner, ask your child to help you follow the steps in a recipe. As you fix a sink or repair a broken table, ask your child to hand you the tools that you name. As you watch TV together, talk with your child about the programs.
