
Sick Kids? Call the Roosevelt Attendance Line.

Willmar Public Schools is noticing an increase in absences due to gastrointestinal illnesses (vomiting and diarrhea) and respiratory illnesses, including influenza. The best way to keep your child healthy and protect the health of others is to keep your child home when they are ill. Sending a child to school when ill or back to school too soon from an illness cannot only infect other students and staff, but it can also cause the child to become ill again and end up missing more time from school.



When calling the school because your child is ill, please call the **Attendance Line at 320-231-8470**. It is not necessary to call the main office and speak with a staff person. You can leave a message with your name, your child's name and grade, teacher's name and symptoms your child is experiencing such as sore throat, cough, vomiting/diarrhea, or a confirmed diagnosis of an illness.

Principal's Corner



Happy New Year! It seems amazing to think that we have bid farewell to yet another year in 2014 and have now welcomed 2015! The thought of a new year always bring hope for new promises, new plans, and new resolutions!

As a Focus School (designation from MN Department of Education) we are working with a sense of urgency to address our achievement gap and the fact that we need to grow ALL students. Our School Improvement Plan focuses us as a teaching staff to embed certain strategies that will allow all students to access the class work. Teachers are working hard to hone their practices and examine data closely to determine which of their students need support and/or opportunities to accelerate. Our focus remains on both Math and Reading

and we are all working extremely hard to give all students a rigorous experience while honing in on all areas where we need to close the achievement gap. Please feel free to call me if you have questions or comments. As we move into the new year, just a few reminders for families as we welcome the month of January:

Dress for Winter: Please be sure that your children are dressed appropriately for the winter weather. All children will go outside every day as long as the "feels like" temperature is above -10 degrees or above -10 degrees wind chill. It is important that they have boots, snowpants, mittens/gloves, hats, and a warm jacket to be able to play in the snow. If they do not have snow clothes, please let us know as we have items to give away.

Picture ID: Due to school safety we are asking adults to show a picture identification at the main door to then be buzzed in. The purpose is to be sure all who enter the school have a legitimate reason. Please remember that school officially begins at 8:30 a.m. each day. Students who arrive after 8:30 a.m. are considered tardy and need to report to the main office before going to their classroom. Parents should accompany their children to the main office to check them in.

Drop off and pick up: Directly in front of the main door is a fire land and there is no parking. If you need to come into the building, please park your vehicle in a parking spot. Please be sure you are aware of any students who may be walking on sidewalks or walkways around the school. Backing up onto sidewalks, backing into the school driveways, parking on sidewalks, and traveling at high speeds in a school zone are unsafe practices and we encourage everyone to raise their level of awareness, especially when there is snow and ice on the ground. 


Unpaid Balances




