Kindergarten:

In Kindergarten we are enjoying reading gingerbread stories. In math we continue to work on our numbers.

1st Grade:

We are doing another writing project. This project is on if outdoor recess or indoor recess is preferred. In math we are adding and subtracting. We are also working on time and money. Please continue to read at home with your child.

2nd Grade:

Happy December!

Last month to show how we cared for those in our community, we decorated lunch bags for seniors. This month we are working on showing gratitude. In math we finished a unit on rounding and estimating right before Thanksgiving and we are now working on adding and subtracting double digit numbers. We'll focus a lot this month on word problems as we use strategies like partial sums and differences, open number lines, and "funny numbers" to solve the problems. In reading, we wrapped up learning how to identify both the topic of a text as well as the focus of several paragraphs. We also identified key details we learned after reading expository texts. Now, we're reading fiction texts and using plot diagrams to recount stories. We're excited about reading stories from different cultures this month. Our 6 Trait Writing started with an emphasis on getting and sticking to an idea for writing. Now we are working on how to better organize our writing. Please continue to encourage your child to read every day and to listen to them read whenever possible!

3rd Grade:

We've been busy in third grade! We have been working hard on writing summaries, learning multiplication and division, and practicing finding theme throughout the stories we read. Coming up in December we are going to wrap up our multiplication and division unit, and practice some algebra for math. We are going to keep working on theme, as well as turn our focus to finding the main idea and details in Non-fiction stories. For our late start this month, look for some festive holiday art projects!

4th Grade:

It's hard to believe we are in December already. In the reading curriculum the fourth graders have been working hard on understanding character development and determining theme in stories. We continue to provide several reading opportunities each day in the classrooms with both individual and group experiences. This month's focus in math is decimals. Students will eventually be able to use decimals in a wide variety of real life situations. We as fourth grade teachers ask that you continue to encourage and support your children with their learning.






