PreK:

Preschool has been working on counting and 1:1 correspondence (counting the correct number of objects to match the number). We have also been working on naming the letters in our names and what sounds they make.







Kindergarten:

We hope everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving! We are thankful for your kindergartener and your family:) Please continue to read with your child at home. That is SO very important. It is also important to discuss beginning and ending sounds in words, rhyming, and practice finding the character, setting, problem, and solution in a story. These are big focuses for us in literacy at school. In math we are finding 2D and 3D shapes in our world! Can you find any shapes together around your home? As always, please reach out with any questions you have!

1st Grade:

As our students continue to work on making progress toward their individual academic goals, your help at home is crucial to practice and reinforce skills that are taught at school. We are so grateful that you are making sure that your child is completing homework neatly and carefully. *Reading-*

Week 1: Classes will be focusing on how people can help out in their community. People can participate in their community for the common good.

Week 2: We will be focusing on using maps to find their way around town. There are many kinds of maps. Maps help people identify physical features, such as mountains or bodies of water.

Week 3: We will be focusing on the different ways we can measure time. Time can be measured by a clock, a shadow, and even an hour glass.

Week 4: Our classes will be focusing on how plants change as they grow. We will discuss how plants are living things that need food and water—just like us!

1st Grade (continued):

Comprehension-

- •Students will learn to retell a story in order using the words first, next, then, last, and story element to improve their comprehension of the story. Students will be able to identify the problem, solution, setting (where the story is taking place) and the characters of the story.
- •Students will determine the central message and supporting details. Central message is what the author wants you to learn from a story that you can use in your life.

Math-

This month in math the focus is to...

- 1. Solve put together/take apart with addend unknown word problems and relate counting on to the take from ten strategy.
- 2. Solve add to with change unknown problems, related varied addition and subtraction strategies.
- 3. Strategize to solve take from with change unknown problems.
- 4. Strategize and apply understanding of the equal sign to solve equivalent expressions.

2nd Grade:

We are in our last month of the calendar year! It is an exciting month in 2nd Grade. We have worked hard in the last month to retell a story using a plot diagram! Students are working hard with Fiction stories to find the characters, setting, events, problem, and solution. They are awesome! In math, we finished place value and got right into adding and subtracting two-digit numbers! They are learning and practicing many strategies to solve these problems!

3rd Grade:

The third grade teachers have been so impressed with the students' flexibility and resilience during this time! We are excited to move on to our new unit in Reading and a new module in Math! Our students will be learning about figurative language and poetry and working through finding the theme or central message of a fiction text. In math we will be moving back to Multiplication and Division! We hope everyone has a cheerful Holiday Season!

4th Grade:

Students have learned how to multiply multi-digit numbers and have started to learn about division using many different strategies. In reading, we have been talking about plot and will be moving to theme. Students will think about what they can learn from the books they are reading.

Attendance will be taken at our Morning Meetings at 8:30 everyday. If you have questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to contact your students teacher.

5th Grade:

It's been a jammin' time in 5th grade. We finished up with division and now we are diving into geometry, which is one of our favorite units to teach! In literacy we are back into fiction stories where we are finding themes and lessons from them. You kids are working so hard, thank you for all your support.

EL:

What if parents don't speak English and don't know how to read?

Even if a parent cannot read, there are many ways they can develop their children's oral language skills and support their literacy efforts.

Here are a few ideas: storytelling, "read" wordless picture books, say rhymes and sing songs, take trips to the public library, engage in meaningful conversation, watch educational children's programs together. Talking together in any language is helpful!




Stem:



Applications will be reviewed on a first come, first served basis. Applicants must submit a receipt(s) for eligible expenses incurred between 9/1/2020 - 12/30/2020 at application. Upon approval, recipients will be mailed a check for the award amount.

- Eligible expenses can be incurred between September 1 December 30, 2020.
- Receipts must be submitted with your application. (If this is not possible, please provide the extenuating circumstance in the upload area. Follow up review will be necessary)
- One award per household will be available unless additional funds become available.

This opportunity will end by December 30, 2020. A total of \$150,000 is available for this outreach.
