

Pre K:

We would like to thank all the parents that came to our Families Learning Together day at school! Your children always love getting to spend time with you here and show you all they are learning. The children have been doing a great job of putting all their winter clothing on all by themselves! This is a great self help skill that they have learned. Please remember to check their backpacks everyday for notes we may send home and to talk with them about what they have brought home. See you all at conferences!

Kindergarten:

Hello from kindergarten! Brrrrr! It's cold out! Please make sure your child has snow pants, boots, mittens, hat, and a warm coat. We go outside even if it is cold (to-10)! We have been busy learning since we got back from break! We are reading, sounding out 3 letter words, rhyming, and naming characters and settings in stories. In math we learned to add~ compose numbers! We will start subtraction~ decomposing next week! You can help at home with objects to 10. (pennies, cheerios, buttons, etc.) to ask your child to add or subtract. We are also counting by 2's, 5's and 10's, and learning teen numbers. Keep reading!

1st Grade:

We have been having lots of fun in first grade! We made it to 2020 and all of the students are ready to learn! In literacy we will be learning about how animals survive in the wild. We will be focusing on asking and answering questions and finding the main topic of a text. In Math we will be working on decomposing and composing two digits numbers using place value charts. Students will work on identifying tens, and ones in a number. Student will learn how to Compare the efficiency of counting by ones and counting by tens. Use the place value chart to record and name tens and ones within a two-digit number. Interpret two-digit numbers as either tens and some ones or as all ones. Write and interpret two-digit numbers as addition sentences that combine tens and ones. Identify 10 more, 10 les s, 1 more, and 1 less than a two-digit number. Use dimes and pennies as representations of tens and ones. Please be sure you are checking your student's backpack each night! Thank you for all of your support at home with your student!

2nd Grade:

Happy February! In second grade we have been busy using strategies to add and subtract 2 and 3-digit numbers. This month we will focus on solving real world and mathematical problems. We will solve using repeated addition and arrays. In reading our focus will be author's purpose, comparing and contrasting fiction stories, and theme. In social studies we will learn about President's Day. We will practice map skills in science. Thank you for all you do with your child at home!



3rd Grade:

February is here and we hope you are staying warm! We are getting back into our routines after a long, fun winter break. Our students have come back ready to continue learning and to face every challenge! All 3rd Grade classrooms have been working hard on area models, and have also started to work with fractions! In literacy, students have been finding a theme, or central message, of the stories we have been reading together. We also had the Minnesota Science Museum out of Minneapolis come visit our grade in January and it was SO MUCH FUN! We are so excited to see all of you at conferences in just a few weeks!

4th Grade:

The new year is off to a great start in fourth grade! Happy 2020! We have been focused on text structure in reading, and will soon be moving onto inferences! In math, we are just finishing up our geometry unit and are looking forward to tackling fractions next! For social studies, we've been learning about the various regions of the United States. As a reminder, please continue to have students bring proper winter gear for the cold weather during these winter months. Also, we are very excited for our upcoming parent conferences on February 6th, 13th, and 14th!

5th Grade:

Whoa! February already! Parent-Teacher Conferences are coming up and our students have been working so hard this winter since break! Most of January has been spent in informational texts in Reading. Students have been finding the main ideas and key details as well as quoting accurately to defend their answers. Math has consisted of fractions, division, order of operations and the beginnings of geometry! We just wrote our Martin Luther King Jr. Essays that expressed our feeling about what Martin Luther King Jr. means to us! We are looking forward to more geometry and beginning our research projects soon!

Media:

Welcome to February! This month we will be reading books about how things are built and how they work. Let's put our engineering and creativity skills to work! Come to the library for a fun challenge that involves building things out of LEGO's! And if you have a special LEGO project you've been working on at home, take a picture of it and bring it into the library to display on our LEGO Wall of Fame. EVERYTHING IS AWESOME!









Music:

The days are officially getting longer again! As we head into the late winter/early spring months be watching the newsletters for information about student music performances and/or informances for grade 1 through 5.

EL:

ELL students will be taking the ACCESS for ELLs 2.0 assessment starting in February. ACCESS for ELLs 2.0 is an English language proficiency assessment for grades K–12. The test is administered every year to help school districts monitor the English language development of students identified as English language learners in four sections Listening, Reading, Speaking, and Writing.

STEM:

3rd Grade: Now that we know all the Planets of the Solar System, it's time to see the LIGHT and Hear the SOUND in our new unit.

4th Grade: Things are Heating up and Getting ELECTRIC at the End of January and Continuing into February and March for the HEAT and Electricity Unit.

5th Grade: The Simple things (in the Simple Machine unit) will be wrapping up, and February we will learn about Animal Adaptations and see how they Survive!!



PE:

February we have our fundraiser for kindergarten and 1st grade with pennies for patients to help children that have Leukemia (Cancer). Also grades 2 to 5 are doing Kids Heart Challenge, which all proceeds go to the American Heart Association. Look for our information sheets for fundraisers at the beginning of February.







Nurse:

February is National Dental Health Month. Believe it or not, there is a strong correlation between healthy teeth and gums and kids' success in school! According to the American Dental Association, kids with oral pain and infections tend to have difficulty concentrating and therefore their ability to learn decreases. Sometimes a student isn't able to express or describe the oral pain they are feeling and it comes out as anxiety, depression, or poor behavior. Left untreated, oral disease caused by tooth decay can cause not only problems learning, but also speech difficulties and difficulty eating/weight loss.

Things your child can do to promote healthy teeth and gums:

- -Brush twice daily for two minutes each time
- -Floss once daily with the help of an adult
- -Avoid sugary foods, especially before bed
- -Visit your dentist every 6 months


