Classroom NewsI

Kindergarten

Kindergarten is learning about characters, setting, and major events in a story and retelling stories in reading.

In math, we will be busy finding sums and differences of numbers through number stories.

Your child will be eager to share everything they are learning with you!

1st Grade:

The 100th day of school will be coming up this month! We will do some 100 day activities in reading and math that day. For our reading unit this month we will be reading about animals and asking and answering questions about key details in a text.

For math this month we will be practicing addition and subtraction, counting coins, telling time, and learning about two and three dimensional shapes. Please continue to have your child read their book to you every night.

2nd Grade:

January was a great month in 2nd Grade! We want to thank you for continuing to read with your students each night and fill out their Monthly 20/20 calendar. Your support is so appreciated!

This month we will be working on telling time in math. Please practice telling time to the quarter hour on an analog clock with your child! At the end of the month we will move on to number patterns and arrays.

Our focus in reading this month will be finding the author's purpose of passages, locating cause and effect, and comparing and contrasting texts. We can never say it enough – read, read at home!


3rd Grade:

Hi! The third graders will be finishing up their unit on geometry. After being able to identify and explain the differences between a line, a line segment, and a ray as well as perpendicular, parallel, and intersecting lines, they will be working on naming and identifying the different attributes

of polygons. From there, they will be moving to fractions!

In literature they are learning how to determine the main idea of a text and to recount the key details, and explain how those details support the main idea. We ask that you continue to support your child's reading at home. The

third graders are doing a great job of reading independently for 30 minutes during literature block every day! Hope to see you at conferences.



4th Grade:

In 4th Grade, we are working hard in Math to wrap up our Fractions Unit where students are able to use many models to represent and compare fractions. We will be moving into the Data Analysis Unit this month.

In Reading we are into text structure learning about cause and effect, problem and solution, compare and contrast, an order sequence. We are anxious for warmer weather in February so we can have some outdoor recess.

5th Grade:

Happy February! Even though the weather seems to be getting warmer make sure that your child is still bringing their winter clothes. The weather here is unpredictable.

Math: We will be working on Algebra as well as some Data Analysis. Students get to create different kinds of graphs. We continue to work hard and have a growth mindset.

Reading: We are moving onto Unit 5. In this unit we learn about the importance of water to our world. They will be introduced to characters who find a solution to a drought.

DARE: This is the last month for DARE. We look forward to DARE graduation on February 8th. It will be held in the auditorium in WEAC at 1:30. Family members are encouraged to come and support their child.

Make sure to look for information about Middle School visiting our classrooms. This is a way to get your child ready for the transition to the Middle School.


