Kindergarten:

Happy New Year! In reading, we will be working on retelling stories and identifying characters, setting, and major events. In math, we will sort, compare numbers, add numbers up to 5 and introduce measurement. Please continue to ask your child about his/her day. We are learning so many things and they would love to share with you!

1st Grade:

We will be learning about place value in math: describing numbers by tens and ones. In reading we will work on retelling stories and asking and answering questions while reading. Books will continue to be sent home for your child to read to you.

2nd Grade:

Second grade will be busy with a flurry of math & reading in January. Upcoming topics will be working with money and telling time. Reading will focus on learning to use more text features in nonfiction, and examining the author's purpose in writing a text. Remember to read with your child on a regular basis and reinforce money & time this month!

3rd Grade:

Happy New Year! Third Grade was busy before winter break working to finish up projects, multiplication, division, algebra, and have some holiday fun too! After break we are starting our Geometry unit for math and will be continuing to work on theme, main idea, and details during literacy. We ask that you talk to your child about their book after they finish reading their 20 minutes at home each day. Ask them about the characters in their book and what they learned, or for 3-5 key events that have happened so far in their books. This will help with their understanding of what they are reading. We hope our students enjoy their break and are prepared for a great month of learning in January





4th Grade:

As we come back from Winter Break we are rested and ready to dig deep with our learning! We will be starting an opinion writing project, teaching the students how to provide facts and state their opinions on a specific topic. In reading, we will be working on finding text structures throughout our weekly stories and our independent texts. In math, we will be spiraling our decimal unit as we begin working with fractions. Lastly, we will continue our learning in social studies with the different regions in the United States.

5th Grade:

5th Grade is excited to enter the new year! This month we have many new units.

Math:

We will be working on adding and subtracting fractions during our next math unit while revisiting and building on prior knowledge and skills from our prior units. Each week we learn and play a new game and tackle hard stuff!

Reading:

Moving on to Unit 4. This unit's theme is Justice. Students will learn about civil rights, equality, the Underground Railroad, and child labor laws to name just a few. They will be introduced to historical figures and events that changed America for the better.

Writing:

Students are learning how to write a small Research Paper as part of the writing standards for MN.

Students continue to learn how to summarize literature and informational text.

DARE: 1 page Essays will be written in preparation for graduation of the program. 1 essay from each classroom will be chosen by the DARE Officer and Teacher. Student chosen will have the honor of reading their essay at the graduation ceremony. Look for an invitation and check the January calendar for graduation date.





5th Grade (continued):

Social Studies:

Students are researching and writing about individuals who contributed to changing Early American History.

In February look for information about Middle School Staff visiting our classrooms and helping us prepare for transition to Middle School. They will visit us 3 times before we head over for a tour.

P.E. :

In January we will be focusing on: hockey, racquets and bowling. We are excited for January!

Music:

As we head into the new year in music the upper grades will continue working on demonstrating the skills they are learning by showing their independence in playing instruments. For grade 5 that is the recorder and for grades 3 and 4 the bells. Kinder through 2nd grade will learn new concepts and skills through singing and movement. Watch upcoming newsletters for information on opportunities to see your kids in action through Songfests and Informances in 2018.

At Roosevelt on Friday, January 12th at 6:30pm


