I also want to let you know our MN Comprehensive Assessments (MCA's) in Reading (3rd-5th), Math (3rd-5th), and Science (5th) will happen in April and May. As a district and building, we use the MCA results to find out 1) how well we have aligned our curriculum and instruction to meet the Minnesota Academic Standards in Reading, Mathematics, and Science and 2) how our school compares to others in the district and in the state.

Pre K:

Thank you so much to all the families that attended school conferences! It is so important to be involved in your child's education. In preschool we have been working on listening for the beginning sound in words- what letter does it start with and what objects begin with the same sound. We are also working on listening for the ending sound in words- which words rhyme or end with the same sound. Reading books with your children and talking about the words is a great way to practice these skills

Kindergarten:

We are hoping spring will officially come our way this month! We enjoyed a FUN month in February celebrating friendship and how much we've learned already in kindergarten on the 100th day of school! We also enjoyed seeing families at conferences and talking about your wonderful children - thank you for sharing them with us! This month we will be working more on addition and subtraction sentences & getting into teen numbers (11-20). We talk about how teens are a group of ten and ____ more. Counting and addition/subtraction practice with any objects you have at home is always helpful! As always please continue to read and practice blending 3-letter words, putting sounds together, and sight words. Thank you for your partnership!

1st Grade:

February has been a busy month in First Grade! We had a great time on our field trip to The Village Museum, celebrated Valentine's Day, AND we celebrated our 100th Day of school! We want to thank you all for coming to conferences this month as well. We really appreciate your time and support you are giving to your child(ren). In the month of March, we'll be focusing on place value in math as we compare, add, and subtract numbers. In reading, we will continue to focus on key details in a text as we ask and answer questions. We'll also talk about characters, settings, and events in a story. Please continue to send warm outside clothes this month! Thank you for all you do!











2nd Grade:

We would like to thank all families for attending our winter conferences! It was great to get to connect with each of you and share our students' great accomplishments! We are excited to continue our learning together! Please remember the dates for spring break are March 28-April 1. In Literacy, we are looking at recounting stories! This is a great comprehension strategy. If you can, please support your child by reading nightly with them and then asking them to retell characters, setting, problem, events, and solution! Rounding and estimating in math is finishing up and we are starting Module 6, which is all about multiplication and division! We look forward to continuing our work together!

3rd Grade:

Hello 3rd grade parents and guardians! February has really flown by. This past month in math we have practiced a variety of skills, one of which being fractions! In literacy we have had an amazing time working on various topics such as poetry, dramas, fables, and folktales. Also, can't forget about our fun Valentine celebration! We are excited and eager for the month ahead.

4th Grade:

Wow! It is crazy to think that it is March already! On Tuesday, March 1st, fourth graders are lucky enough to take a field trip to the High School to watch the Middle School performance of Moana the Musical. This is a wonderful opportunity for our students to see 7th and 8th graders perform in front of an audience. It also allows these children to see the wonderful activities that are offered for them as they grow through WPS. Our next literacy unit focuses on drama, which ties in well to the elements of a play. We will learn about stage directions, characters, dialogue and other important parts to a play. Although learning about parts of a play is fun, we have also been working on fractions during math core and will be starting on decimals in March. Social studies and writing are very much a part of our content lessons on a weekly basis. One final note, as the weather starts to warm up, there is still plenty of snow and puddles outside near the playground. Please make sure your child is bringing their snow gear to school.











5th Grade:

Could spring be around the corner? It may be hard to believe, but it really is! In fifth grade we are enjoying getting to explore geometry in math; finding the area and volume or 2D and 3D figures. In reading we are learning about how to find an author's point of view and analyzing multiple accounts about the same event or topic. We enjoyed getting to participate in DARE this year and we were so proud of our students for graduating. We now have had middle school counselors come for twice to talk about sixth grade and we will have a visit from them this month too. Thank you for your continued support of what we do here in fifth grade!

Music:

Students in music class are gearing up for our first Songfest in two years! We have been singing lots of new songs! K-2 are learning new rhythms like Ti-Ti, Ta, Ta-ah, Ta Rest, and Ta-ka-di-mi. 3rd grade is learning letter note names on the Treble Clef Staff, and finding those notes on xylophones to play songs. 4th has been working on matching rhythms that they see with rhythms that they hear as well as learning 4 new notes- eighth note, dotted quarter note, dotted half note, eighth rest, and triplet. 5th Grade has been learning about different kinds of harmony such as descant and round and the note names for bass clef.

EL:

Multilingual learners practice using academic vocabulary every day at school. A skill that students use frequently is comparing and contrasting two different things. You can help your student practice this skill by comparing and contrasting different things in your everyday life. Try using the phrases, "They are the same because," and "They are different because." Helping students to practice using this academic vocabulary will increase their confidence to speak up and practice in school!









STEM:

3rd Grade: We will finish up the Sound Unit and continuing with the Light Unit for third grade.

4th Grade: It's HOT and ELECTRIC...We will finish up the Heat Unit and start Electricity 5th Grade: We will be starting Animal Adaptations and how they survive just like we are trying to survive winter here in MN!

PE:

Physical Education classes will be starting floor hockey this month. Pacer test for 3rd-5th graders before spring break. Remember during spring break to stay active.

Art:

K-2 art students continue to use the elements of art to create their own artworks. We have learned about artists Paul Klee and James Rizzi and are creating pieces in their styles with a little Van Gogh thrown in. If you are in the building, come check out the artwork in the hall by the library. We have very talented artists!




