CLASSROOM NEWS



Kindergarten:

Happy Spring! In reading, we will continue to retell stories and ask and answer questions. We will be focusing on the organization trait for writing. The students will write stories that include what happens first, next, and last. In math, we will be reviewing shapes, patterns, sorting, composing, decomposing, and number sense. Thank you for supporting your child and their learning!

1st Grade:

We will be finishing up with Unit 6 in reading, which focuses on retelling stories and explaining the theme or central message of a story. Please continue to have your child read their book to you each night. In writing we will continue to write narratives and opinions. We will complete the last writing project: writing a thank you letter. In math we will finish up the year with Unit 8, which includes many of the skills we've worked on this year. You can continue to have your child practice addition and subtraction facts, counting money, and telling time at home. Stay tuned for information on a field trip this month! Look for more information to come in the next few weeks!

Over the summer: to ensure your child is ready for the next school year, over the summer have them read every day (15-20 minutes). You can check out books from the Willmar Public Library. You can also play math games with cards or dice.



2nd Grade:

This month second graders will continue our study of plants in Science. In reading, we will examine how characters can have different viewpoints. Using data and graphs will follow measurement in Math. We look forward to our field trip to Prairie Woods on May 17 or 18!! Watch for the reminder from your child's teacher!

3rd Grade:

The third graders have worked hard all year and have learned an amazing amount of new skills. They also prepared well for and did a great job on taking the MCA tests! We are now going to spend the rest of the year revisiting and sharpening those skills so we are ready for the fourth grade!

We will also be exploring and studying how people lived in the late 1800's. This is in preparation for Heritage Week and our field trip on May 9th to Montevideo. We are so excited about this trip.

Third graders are continually working hard on becoming better readers and building up their reading stamina. They will also be making plans on how they will continue their reading practices over the summer months. That way they will start the next year prepared and ready to go.

4th Grade:

It is the end of the year, and we are excited because we will be studying the different types of poetry and writing a few of our own. We will then display and share our poetry with each other. In Math we will be working on some math projects. Our field trips will consist of fishing, golfing, and banking. We will also have field day where we get to showcase our athletic ability and learn how to be team players. We are so ready to be outside and feel the warmth of spring for recess and ready to move into 5th grade!



5th Grade:

May will be a busy month for 5th graders. We will visit the Middle School and prepare for 6th grade. We will also be visiting a dairy farm on a field trip sponsored by the Willmar Chamber.

Unit 8 in Reading will be a Big Idea- we will learn about inventions and businesses.

Math will wrap up algebra.



Music:




PTSA:


