

3) Summer Reading Books

Students in grades K-4th will be receiving *Summer Book bags to take home* which will provide them with a total of 10 books, reading activities, a journal, pencils and postcards. We're also working to provide an opportunity at Lakeland during summer school to allow *Roosevelt staff to check-in on our students summer reading* with book talks and giving them feedback on their activity sheets and journal writing. Prek:

We can't believe it is the last month of school already! Just a reminder to make sure you submitted your paperwork for kindergarten registration. If you have questions about this please check with your child's teacher. We have been enjoying a new playhouse and some new toys on our playground- ask your child to tell you their favorite thing to do outside!

<u>K:</u>

It is so hard to believe we are already in May! Despite the many obstacles this year has thrown at us, we as a Kindergarten team are SO very thankful to have spent this year with your child and your family. Thank you for your partnership and for sharing your sweet kindergartener with us! A few tips of things you could work on at home as the year concludes and continue throughout the summer:

- 1. Writing numerals and letter correct formation, sight words, writing the sounds your child hears in other words and turning them into sentences
- 2. Math addition and subtraction practice (up to 20), patterns, shapes, and simple story problems
- 3. Reading stretching out 3-letter words, rhyming, sight words, beginning middle and end of a story, facts in non-fiction books and READ READ READ to and with your child!
- 4. PLAY Playing with your child (exploring outdoors, simple games, dramatic play, and hands-on activities) is truly the work of the child and will strengthen all of the above areas!

1st Grade:

Our butterflies have arrived! This month, our students will learn about butterfly, mealworm, and plant life cycles. All classrooms currently have caterpillars that we are observing. We will be releasing butterflies by the end of the month! Some classrooms also have mealworms. Be sure to ask your child about these insects! In Reading this month we will be focusing on retelling stories using key details. We will also determine a story's central message, or lesson. In Math, we will use tape diagrams to solve story problems, review place value to 100, and learn even more addition strategies! We will also focus on pennies, nickels, and dimes and will be able to add them up to a dollar. It will be a busy month - be sure to continue reading with your child each day - they are becoming very good readers!

2nd Grade:

Happy May, 2nd Grade families! We are so thankful for the warmer days and being together. It is hard to believe that our year together is coming to a close. We would like to continue to send along our gratitude for how much you have helped us get through the year! It certainly hasn't been easy, but we have made some great memories together. To finish our year in Math, we will be looking at 2D and 3D shapes! We will also be working with time and clocks. In Literacy, we will be reviewing main idea, as well as reviewing writing skills and other literacy skills previously taught! We are looking forward to finishing the year strong!

3rd Grade:

In math, we will be reviewing some of the standards we have already taught. In literacy, we are looking forward to reading about and doing a project on how to start your own business. Exciting times!
