### Prek:

We can't believe this is our last month of school! Please make sure you have completed your child's kindergarten registration online. This needs to be done so they are enrolled for next year. This month we will be reading many great stories, asking questions about them and checking on the students ability to recall details about the story. You can help us at home by reading a story and asking your child to tell you what it was about. Can they remember some of the details? Can they retell the story? Reading stories is a great opportunity for learning!

### <u>K:</u>

Happy May, kindergarten families! We're in the home stretch of preparing our kindergarteners for first grade! It's unbelievable how quickly this year flew by. The kids have grown so much! We will work hard on reviewing skills in literacy and in math that will help them thrive in first grade before summer break. Please continue to read with your child at home and check their folders daily. As always, we thank you for your support!

#### 1<sup>st</sup> Grade:

Hello First Grade Families! We made it through the long winter! Please remember to keep an eye on the weather/temperature and send the appropriate clothing for recess/phy ed for your child. This month we have a lot going on! We will be going on a field trip towards the end of this month, so keep an eye out for more information in the coming weeks. Let your child's teacher know if you have any questions. In Reading this month, we will be learning about how to retell a story. We will also be able to understand a story's central idea, message, or moral. In math, we will be reviewing place value and number sense. We will also be reviewing other skills we've been learning all year. Check your child's backpack for additional information coming home this month. We can hardly believe we're almost to summer - it's been a memorable year!

### 2nd Grade:

Hello sunshine, summer and super second grade families,

We are nearing the end of second grade, but we are still working very hard and learning so many new and fun things. In literacy, we will be identifying main topics, learning about poems and writing fictional narratives. In math, we will have a mixed review, learn about arrays and repeated addition, patterns and fractions. We are all very excited for our class field trip to Prairie Woods Environmental Learning Center. Wednesday, May 17th (Ms. Holme's and Ms. Peterson's Classes) and Thursday, May 18th (Mr. Farber's and Ms. Chaput's Classes). This is a wonderful opportunity for our kids to step back in time and see what life was like for the early settlers of Minnesota. The cost of the field trip is being covered by the Roosevelt PTSA. ### 3rd Grade:

Hello, families! In April, 3rd graders took the MCA Literacy & Math tests for the first time - they got to show off everything they've learned this year! We have some exciting days coming up as we head into our final month of school. Be on the look-out for dates to come about our Field Day, Stinger's Kickball game and field trips - we will update as we get those dates secured! As the weather gets warmer, so do our classrooms - please be sure that your student is dressed appropriately for the weather and for school. This year has FLOWN by and we are so thankful for the time we've gotten to spend with our third graders and look forward to the last few weeks together! As a team, we want to extend a sincere thank you to all of our students and families for making this year so special. We will miss you!

### 4th Grade:

Wow! How is it already May? Our fourth graders have been working very hard this spring academically and preparing to be fifth graders. As teachers, we are so proud of their hard work, perseverance, and grit they have shown. In April, they took the math and reading MCAs and will take the STAR tests in May. We will continue to work on becoming proficient with our priority standards in both math and reading through the end of the school year. Although we have a lot academically to "finish up" in May, we also get to participate in some fun activities as well. We will be finishing the Stinger Reading Program for a way to earn a free ticket to a Stingers Game. Our songfest is on May 12th at 2:00 in the Roosevelt gym. The Artist in Residence will be at Roosevelt teaching us some wonderful art skills. Field Day is on May 24th at 9:00 at Kennedy. Finally, we are excited to once again have the opportunity to go fishing with our Willmar Chapter Let's Go Fishing. This is a wonderful day filled with fishing, water safety from our Kandiyohi County Sheriff's Department and the DNR presenting on a variety of species of fish and our local fisheries. We look forward to all of these fun events with your child as we wrap up another wonderful school year.

### 5th Grade:

Hello families! It is getting warmer these days which we are thankful for! We have a lot of great things planned for May like a middle school visit, field trip to Sibley, farm field, track and field day and Songfest. In math we will be reviewing standards we need some extra work on and in reading we will learning about planning our own business. We are ready for a great month!













### Music:

2nd and 3rd grade just performed a Joy filled Songfest in March! The performance is posted on the Cardinal View youtube channel. They are now working on identifying their emotions they experience during different kinds of music, and comparing and contrasting different sections of music.

4th and 5th are gearing up for their Song Fest on May 12th at 2:00pm. We hope you'll join us! They've also been hard at work learning ukulele and recorder.

Kinder is learning how to read rhythms with Ta (quarter note), Ti-ti (eighth notes) and Ta Rest (quarter rest) and 1st grade is learning how to write their own music using those rhythms.

### STEM:

Kindergarten: In kindergarten STEM we are comparing the needs of animals and plants.

1st Grade: In first grade STEM we continue to learn about weathering and erosion.

2nd Grade: In second grade STEM we are learning about predicting weather.

3rd Grade: In third grade STEM we are starting to learn about life cycles of different organisms.

4th Grade: In fourth grade STEM we are starting to learn about inherited traits.

5th Grade: In fifth grade STEM we are continuing to learn about forces of motion and energy.

#### EL:

School is almost over, but that doesn't mean students need to stop reading or learning! Summer is a great time to read together as a family! Plan trips to the library so your kids can choose books that are about things they are interested in. Demonstrate a positive attitude about learning and reading by taking time to read with your child. Continuing to learn and grow over the summer doesn't have to take a lot of time or effort. Take advantage of situations to notice things outside in nature and talk about them together!




### **Greeting Roosevelt Families!**


