CLASSROOM NEWS



Pre K:

I can't believe the school year is almost over! If you did not attend kindergarten registration, please make sure to stop in the office so your child gets registered at the correct school for next year. We will be sending home your child's portfolio work at the end of May, but if you have any questions about how your child is doing please don't hesitate to ask their teacher. Also, please make sure to check out various classes and activities that you can register your child for over the summer to keep them engaged and learning!

Kindergarten:

Wow – one short month of learning left before first grade! Time is flying!

In reading, we are focusing heavily on our list of sight words as we near the end of the year. Please practice the sight word list inside the take home folder with your child at home. Knowing the sight words is so important for beginning readers!

In math, we have been learning about number bonds, number stories, and number sentences. We are starting to learn more about the teen numbers now. We will be composing and decomposing numbers 11-20 and counting to 100.

We are looking forward to another great month in Kindergarten!



1st Grade:

In reading we are retelling stories, identifying themes in stories, and identifying main topic and key details in nonfiction texts. In writing we are writing letters, narratives, and opinions. In math we are adding, subtracting, composing and decomposing numbers up to 100. We are also solving story problems using tape diagrams. Please continue having your child complete their reading homework as we end the school year. Information on field trips will be coming soon!

2nd Grade:

May is an exciting month for second graders. We will be reading many fiction and non fiction books to our comprehension strategies like retelling, asking and answering questions, theme, topic and key details. In math, we will be telling time and describing 2-D and 3-D shapes. Also, we will be participating in the Grow a Pizza program and visiting Prairie Woods Environmental Learning Center and the Recycling Center. It's going to be a fun month of learning!!

3rd Grade:

Hi, In May our third graders will be revisiting "main idea" in Lit Block. They will be working on determining the main idea of a text, recounting the key details and explaining how they support the main idea. They will also be reading stories to pick out the theme or the lesson and how it is conveyed through the key details. Additionally they will be describing the relationship between a series of historical events, scientific ideas, or steps in a technical procedure using language that pertains to time, sequence, and cause and effect.

In Math, the students will be finishing up their first year with Eureka math! They will be studying Multiplication and Area. They will be exploring area as an attribute of two dimensional figures and relate it to their prior learning.

Our students worked hard this year and we hope they enjoy their summer.

4th Grade:

In 4th grade we have been working hard! In reading, we started unit 7, where we are comparing and contrasting and learning about space. We will be working on writing a research paper. In social studies, we finished learning about the regions with the west and southwest regions of the United States. We have been working through Module 7, measurement in math. We are looking forward to our field trip on May 17, with Let's Go Fishing. Please make sure to have your forms in.

5th Grade:

Hello from 5th grade once again! As we move into our last month of school we have many things to be looking forward to! We have just finished up the Math and Reading MCA tests and still have the Science one to complete. We will be beginning some very hands on math projects this month in hopes of using all of the skills we have learned throughout the year! Nurse notes:

We are all SO excited to get outside after this long, cold winter. In your excitement, don't forget to protect your child's (and your own!) skin from the sun's damaging rays.

Here are some sun safety reminders from the American Academy of Pediatrics.



Sun Safety for Kids

- Be sure to apply enough sunscreen -- about one ounce per sitting for a young adult.
- The sun's rays are the strongest between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Try to keep out of the sun during those hours.
- Wear commercially available sun-protective clothing, like swim shirts and hats.
- Most of the sun's rays can come through the clouds on an overcast day; so use sun protection even on cloudy days.
- When choosing a sunscreen, look for the words "broad-spectrum" on the label - it means that the sunscreen will protect against both ultraviolet B (UVB) and ultraviolet A (UVA) rays. Choose a water-resistant sunscreen and reapply every two hours or after swimming, sweating or towel drying.
- Use a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 15.
- Put on sunscreen 30 minutes before going outdoors - it needs time to work on the skin.
- Sunscreens should be used for sun protection and not as a reason to stay in the sun longer.
- Sunglasses with ultraviolet (UV) protection are also a good idea for protecting your child's eyes.
