






Dear Roosevelt Friends and Family




Here are a few important dates to pass along:

Kindergarten:

This month in reading we are learning our letter sounds, reading nursery rhymes, and practicing our handwriting. 1st Grade:

Happy October! We've had a good 1st month in 1st grade, getting to know your child! This month, our learning will include number sense, place, value, and counting to 120 in math. We will have the opportunity this month to combine some science into our reading as our focus will be on learning about our bones, muscles, brain, and making healthy choices. This unit will help us to focus on skills such as asking and answering questions, and informational text features! Please remember to watch the weather this month! It's going to start getting colder, and our students will need their warmer outdoor gear. 2nd Grade:

This month, we will be practicing solving story problems and reading, writing, and representing numbers in different ways in math. In reading, we will be asking and answering questions about early Asian civilizations and looking for text features in nonfiction books. 3rd Grade:

Hi families! Can you believe it's already October?! Our first month together has flown by. We have spent the month of September learning our classroom procedures and expectations as well as getting to know each other. On top of that, in math we have been reviewing and learning Place Value! We are learning Place Value in numbers up to 100,000! In literacy, we have been learning how to ask and answer questions using a variety of different texts! 5th Grade:

Fifth graders are off to a great start this year! In ELA we are learning how to determine the theme of a story. In Math we are working on place value, and we will be starting on adding and subtracting decimal numbers soon. It will be very important for all 5th grade students to know their multiplication facts by heart so they will be ready for success with multiplying, dividing, and fractions -- please help your child practice at home!

Music:

Roosevelt students have been singing every day in music this month! We are also working on evaluating other people's performances in 4th and 5th grade using the teacher's grading plan, and our own grading plan. 3rd grade is comparing and contrasting the sounds in two different pieces of music. 2nd grade is learning about how we can hear repeated patterns in music. 1st grade is working on hearing and showing steady beat, and Kinder is learning how to move safely to music in the music room. These are our quarter 1 goals in music class.

EL:

We would like to welcome back all of our returning students and families, as well as those of you who are new to us this year! Roosevelt's English language teaching staff is looking forward to a great school year! Language teachers and support staff provide academic support to students that are new to learning English, as well as students whose first language is not English and are bilingual or multilingual. A fun fact about language and Willmar Public Schools students is that 48% speak Spanish, 45% speak Somali, 4% speak Karen, and more than twenty other languages are spoken as well!

STEM:

Grades K-2 are learning about Weather and Sound. Grades 3-5 are learning about Light, Magnetic Force, and Earth rotation and orbit.













PE:

Welcome! This is going to be an amazing year in Physical Education at Roosevelt Elementary. We are excited to be working with your children. Your Physical Education teachers are Mrs. Rosendahl and Mr. Becker

For safety and success in PE, please have your child wear supportive athletic shoes on days they have PE. Please work with your child on tying their shoes.



Second Step is a research based social emotional learning (SEL) program designed to improve students' social emotional skills including growth mindset, goal setting, emotion management, kindness, empathy, bully prevention, and problem solving.

This year at Roosevelt teachers will teach on Mondays a 20 minute lesson weekly on these topics. We are working to create a positive classroom environment and school climate.

These lessons will teach life skills that can be practiced in the classroom and reinforced at home.
