Principal Corner

October 2017

Greetings Roosevelt and Lakeland Parent(s) and Guardian(s) -

We've had a great start to the school year. We've experienced some growing pains and adjustments as two schools are housed under one roof but we are making things work beautifully. We hope you will all attend conferences, it really is important for you to come and hear how your child has been doing. There are things to celebrate and things we need your support on, whether that be helping to get homework done, checking the planner or support behavior, we cannot do it well without your partnership.

Here are a couple things we'd like to call your attention to: Planners, backpacks and homework support:

As we work at school to teach your child, your support at home is critical to your child's success. Every child at Roosevelt and Lakeland has a planner to write down assignments so PLEASE check your child's backpack and planner. Your child may come home and say, "...no I do not have homework I did it in school..." but **please make it a routine to look for yourself**. Check their planners and folders as you may find work needing to be completed, messages to you from the teacher or your child's work that has been completed that may need to find a spot on the refrigerator as they are proud of the work they bring home.

Supporting your child at home with homework comes down to just a few key points.

- Establish a routine: Each night make back pack and planner checks a routine so homework can be completed.
- 2) Create a space: It is best for your child to have a quiet space without distractions so they can focus on their work and get it done with good effort and concentration.
- 3) Model and assist: School work has changed over the year and a call to your child's teacher can shed some light on any questions you have. Your guidance and support is important while your child works on their assignments. As an adult and parent to model and reinforce that homework is important they will have it for many years to come and they need to learn to take responsibility for their learning and also apply effort and perseverance to follow through.

 It is generally agreed that the younger the child, the less time the child should be expected to devote to homework. A general rule of thumb is that children do 10 minutes of homework for each grade level. Therefore, first graders should be expected to do about 10 minutes of homework, second graders 20 minutes, third graders 30 minutes, and so on.

Please know we are here at school and open to meeting with you or answering your calls. Working with you in a partnership is something we both value. It is through a partnership that we do the best for your children and our students so please do not hesitate to contact us. Thank you.

Kindergarten:

WHAT IS THIS CLASS CALLED LIBRARY?

Class time spent in Roosevelt's Library Media Center presents learning adventures printed on paper and displayed on screens. Well respected stories and the people who write them are highlighted. Pages bound between covers or pages turned with the click of a mouse are read. Keyboard activities are practiced. (After all, Minnesota's state tests still require some mouse and typing ability.) Fun challenges with online math or reading skills are practiced. "Library" is a lot more than just checking out a printed book. It's a combination of printed book and computer activities that support Roosevelt's general learning goals.



S.T.E.M.:

3rd-STEM- is Bubblicious for our Bubble Lab for teaching Science Inquiry and Making Observations and Measuring. We will then continue to do a Oil and Water Lab and continue to work on measurement for Volume, Mass, and Temperature.

4th-STEM-Continuing with Measurement by doing a Volume Lab, Working on mass of Objects using a balance scale, followed by a Temperature Lab involving Hot Water, Room Temperature, Ice water, and checking our Hand Temperature.

5th-STEM-FORCES UNIT starts with the Gravity Lab, and continued with a Inertia and Friction Lab.

The weather has been wonderful and we still have been able to hold our classes outside. We are practicing good sportsmanship and learning to appreciate everyone's abilities.


