Children are not allowed in the building before 7:45 a.m.. Supervision of children does not begin until 7:45 a.m.. If you need to drop off your child before 7:45 a.m., Cardinal Place is available. Cardinal Place Child Care is available M-F from 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Call Jena at 214-6680 to find out more about child care.

The school day begins at 8:30 a.m. and ends at 3:20 p.m.. It is important for learning that children arrive at school on time and do not leave before dismissal.

When picking up your child, please remember that individuals will not be permitted to pick up children without photo identification.

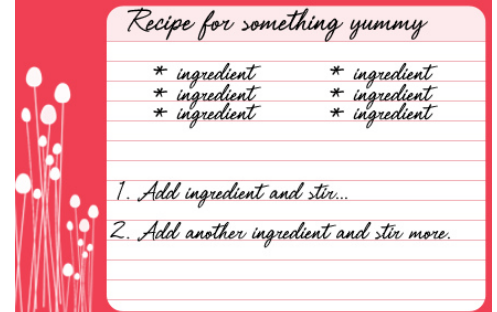
Homemade Granola Bars - Amber Chevalier, Rice Memorial Hospital

Ingredients

- 1 C packed dates, pitted
- 1/4 C honey (or sub maple syrup or agave for vegan option)
- 1/4 C creamy salted natural peanut butter or almond butter
- 1 C roasted unsalted almonds, loosely chopped
- 1 1/2 C rolled oats (gluten free for GF eaters)
- optional additions: chocolate chips, dried fruits, nuts, banana chips, vanilla, etc.

Directions

- Process dates in a food processor until small bits remain (about 1 minute). It should form a “dough” like consistency.
- Optional step: toast your oats in a 350 degree oven for 15 minutes or until slightly golden brown. Otherwise, leave them raw.
- Place oats, almonds and dates in a bowl - set aside.
- Warm honey and peanut butter in a small saucepan over low heat. Stir and pour over oat mixture and then mix, breaking up the dates to disperse throughout.
- Once thoroughly mixed, transfer to an 8x8 dish or other small pan lined with plastic warp or parchment paper so they lift out easily.
- Press down until uniformly flattened. Cover with parchment or plastic wrap, and let set in fridge or freezer for 15-20 minutes to harden.
- Remove bars from pan and chop into 10 even bars. Store in an airtight container for up to a few days. I keep mine in the freezer to keep them extra fresh, but it isn’t necessary.





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Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports (PBIS)

PBIS or Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports is an approach to proactive, school-wide behavior. PBIS applies programs, strategies and practices for all students to increase academic performance, improve safety, decrease problem behavior and establish a positive school culture. Both Roosevelt and Kennedy Elementary use the PBIS model.

Roosevelt has developed Cardinal S.T.A.R.S. based on PBIS. You will see it in every classroom, in the hallways, bathrooms, cafeteria and on the playgrounds.

Roosevelt is utilizing the PBIS model in a variety of ways:

- weekly drawing for breakfast S.T.A.R.S. students
- weekly drawing for VIP lunch students

Breakfast S.T.A.R.S. have a special breakfast in the cafeteria and the VIP lunch students get to sit at a special table for lunch. Look for your child to bring home acknowledgments for their S.T.A.R. behavior. A page is being added to the Roosevelt web page under the *For Parents* tab with Cardinal S.T.A.R.S. information, pictures and fun events.

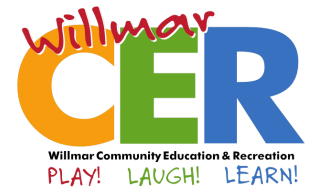

snack and make a pumpkin craft. Its all about pumpkins!

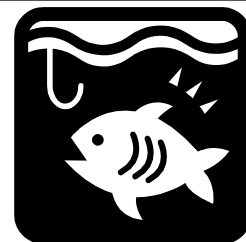
