3rd Grade:



Get your family into a reading routine at the beginning of the school year-



One of the best ways to improve your child's reading is to read every day.

Establish a regular reading time each night.

Encourage your child to read age appropriate materials he/she enjoys.

Greetings from the Roosevelt Health Office! As we start a new school year, we would like to remind you of a few things to keep in mind as we all transition into the new school year.

*It is quite common for Pre K and Kindergarten to need a new set of clothing during the school day-- toileting accidents, wet/mud accidents on the playground, spilled lunch on clothing, etc.—so we ask that our young students have an extra set of clothing in their lockers or backpack.

*In the event that a student does not have extra clothing at school and needs them, parents may have to be notified during the school day to bring extra clothing. Accidents can happen at all ages so we may call for clean clothes.

*Vision and hearing screening will take place at Roosevelt on Thursday, September 20th and Wednesday, October 3rd (rescreen day). All students in Grades K, 1, 3, and 5 will be screened as well as new students and students in Grades 2 or 4 whose parent or teacher requests they be screened. Please have your student wear their glasses (or contacts) those days, as we cannot screen them accurately without them.

*If you have a new student to Roosevelt in grade 2 or 4, call us to be sure we screen them.

*If you do NOT want your child to participate in vision and hearing screening, please notify the school health office in writing. If you would be willing to be a parent volunteer for hearing and vision screening days, please let us know that too!



Tips for a great 1st day of school and the rest of the school year... for parents to review and talk to their child about.

- -Get enough sleep (start bedtime routines a week or two prior school starting).
- -Eat a healthy breakfast.
- -Start talking about school early in a casual relaxed way.
- -Try to have your child meet their teacher prior to the first day of school, if unable to make it to open house or if that may be too overwhelming for your child schedule a time.
- -Let your child wear favorite, comfortable clothes on the first day of school rather than a new, uncomfortable outfit.
- -Encourage children to try their best.
- -Develop good work habits such as writing down assignments and turning in your homework on time.
- -If your child doesn't understand, encourage them to ask the teacher.
- -Communicate with your child's teacher.

How to Spot School Jitters.

- -Child shows excessive distress when parent discusses school.
- -Worries about bad things happening to relatives or caregivers when they are away at school.
- -Shows a fear of being alone.
- -Have nightmares about separation.
- -Complains of nausea, stomachaches or headaches.
