

**Willmar Public Schools
FOOD AND NUTRITION SERVICES (FNS)**

TITLE: GUEST MEALS

POLICY: All meals served to students and adults who are not enrolled in the school district shall be charged at the guest rate.

PROCEDURES:

Guest Lunch Meals will be charged as follows:

1. Adult Guest: \$4.95 for lunch - for anyone not enrolled in a school district.
2. College Student Guest: \$4.95 for lunch – we cannot be reimbursed for these meals as they are not enrolled in the school district.
3. Secondary Student Guest: \$2.25 for lunch – list their name and school district on the Cashier Reconciliation Sheet.
4. Elementary Student Guest: \$2.15 for lunch – list their name and school district on the Cashier Reconciliation Sheet.
5. Children ≤5 years of age (non K-12) Guest: \$4.95 for lunch or charge ala carte prices – list their name and sibling's PIN number on the Cashier Reconciliation Sheet.

Guest Breakfast Meals will be charged as follows:

1. Adult, College Students, and Non-K-12 Children ≤5 years of age: \$2.25 for Breakfast Meal.
2. Elementary/Secondary Student Guest: \$1.95 for breakfast meal.

For all Guest Meals rung into a student's account, the Cashier needs to write the Full name of the person eating the meal (i.e. Ann Smith's Mother and Sister) and the meal will be charged to the student's account if sufficient funds are available or the meal may be paid for via cash transaction.

Students who are enrolled in one school but are visiting another school district (and whose benefit status is undocumented) can be charged the student meal price and claimed as paid. If there is an agreement among school districts and benefit status is documented, the visiting student may be charged and claimed in accordance with his or her benefit status. Students and/or siblings who are not enrolled in any school must be charged the adult meal price.
